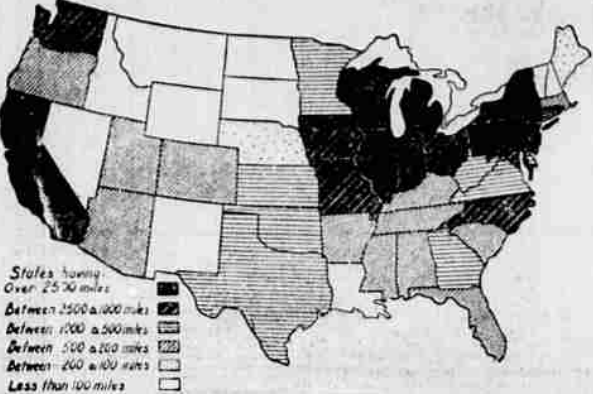


Where Tourists Will Find Concrete Roads
