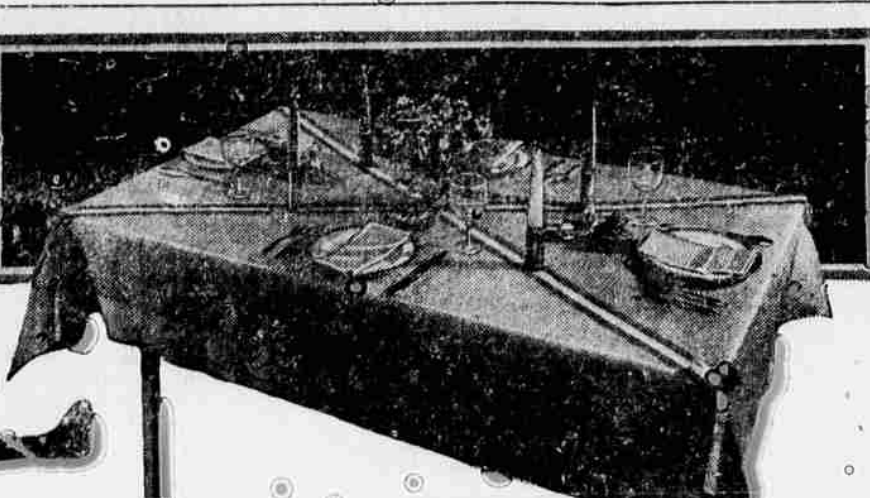

RADIO IMPORTANT FACTOR IN THE AIR TOUR OF NATION

Radio is playing an important part in this year's national air tour, just as it has done in the planes that have crossed the oceans. There is a transmitting set in the Crosley-Waco entry by means of which it is possible for receiving sets on the field to pick up the advance information of the arrival of the plane and of the tourists.

The radio broadcast set is operated on a special experimental base from the federal radio commission, with call letters NXAA, with a wave length of 71.7 meters, 418 kilocycles, and the voice range of transmission is 20 miles. The small Burgess transmitter is used. Amateurs who receive are asked to listen for the story of the flight as the plane nears here for its stop.
