

SPOKANE ROAD-HOUSE SLAYER IS BEING SOUGHT

SPOKANE, Wash., July 6.—(AP)—Authorities here today have appealed to police officers throughout the west to aid in the hunt for Adolph Rosenau, alias Jack La-France, alleged to have murdered Harry Warner by stabbing him with a butcher knife at the Colonial tavern near here yesterday.

Further questioning of witnesses of the slaying revealed that Rosenau became "wild with anger" when he realized the head received a blow at the hands of Harry Warner. The quarrel is said to have started over the fact that Rosenau was a member of the orchestra. The two men fought first with fists and then Rosenau is alleged to have hit Warner with a spade after they had swung out of the tavern by Steve Cook, the proprietor. When others intervened and took the spade from Rosenau, Warner is said to have blackened his eye. Rosenau then rushed to the kitchen and rescued with the three butcher knives and then began stabbing Warner. He caught him on the lawn of the tavern and there, while witnesses heard Warner "boasting for mercy," Rosenau stabbed him through the heart.

P. O. ROBBERY RING OF OREGON BROKEN UP BY SENTENCES

PORTLAND, Ore., July 6.—(AP)—Erasing to a close the activities of a ring which preyed upon village postoffices and small stores in northwestern Oregon, Ben Leasmeier, 27, was today sentenced in federal court to serve six years at McNeil federal prison. Two other members, one a woman, were sent to the county jail.

Leasmeier, who has served two terms at McNeil and two at Salem, pleaded guilty to having been in charge of the ring when it invaded Astoria on the night of May 24 and stole a small amount of cash from the postoffice and merchandise stores.

James Baker, who played a minor part in the robbery, must spend one year in the county jail and Mrs. Baker, four months.

"Stunt" Johnson, who was wounded when captured by the police, was sentenced to seven years at McNeil's Tuesday. Anna Jones received a like sentence and Robert Kennedy was sentenced to one year in the county jail.

HEFLIN FAILS TO APPEAR; MEETING OF K. K. S FAILURE

NEW YORK, July 6.—(AP)—Convicted by Klansmen armed with pistols, clubs and knives, 2000 persons attended a Ku Klux Klan rally in a 10-acre field on Long Island yesterday but the guest of honor, Senator J. Thomas Hefflin, failed to appear.

Late in the afternoon word was received that the senator was speaking at a Klan rally in Jackson, Mich., and obviously would not be able to address the Long Island meeting. The Klansmen who had spent the day in various ceremonies, then disbanded.

MOTORCYCLIST KILLED AT PASS

CHASNEY PASS, Ore., July 6.—(AP)—A 25-year-old man was killed today in the morning when he was run over by a motorcycle on a steep hill on the north slope of Mt. Hood. The motorcycle was found on the hill and the man's body was found nearby. He was identified by papers found on the body.
