**Breaking in New Brakes**

Many so-called brakes suffer great wear during the first few miles of service after they come out of the shop because of the car owner's desire to give them a thorough test. The test idea is all right but the point is that it often is entirely too vigorous. The lining may not have had a chance to get set properly; there may be high or low spots on band or drum which will mean inequality in brake application with consequent uneven wear. It is a good plan to work in the new linings gradually.

**That Five Gallon Habit**

Filling stations report that a large majority of car owners will have the "five gallon habit" that is, that they buy gasoline regularly five gallons at a time. Many motorists, however, have gotten away from this practice. They find that filling the tank is a lot less saving, an assurance against running out of gas, and provides excellent balance at the rear of the car. These advantages are at least worth considering.

**Rolling Speed Varies**

Among those car owners who realize that the car has a rolling speed, a pace at which it consumes the least amount of gasoline, there are many who sacrifice the advantage to be gained thereby by failing to realize that conditions create variations in this speed. For instance, it is related to tire pressure, engine condition, the weather and several other factors. If the car is running into a head-wind, its rolling speed will be higher. It is a matter of "feel."

**"Anywhere" Will Not Do**

There is something wrong about these roadways when the top is removed. By the same token, there is something very wrong about the way the top is treated after it has been taken off. It is not wise to leave the top "just anywhere" about the garage. First it should be folded properly. Then it should be stored away in a clean, dry spot until it is needed again.

**OAKLAND-PONTIAC SALES INCREASE**

Sales of Oakland and Pontiac cars during the first five months of this year reached a record total of 175,305 cars according to figures released at the factory this week.

This volume of sales shows an increase of 49,019 or nearly 62 per cent over the 116,286 Oakland and Pontiac cars sold during the first five months of 1927 when the Oakland Motor Car company was moving up from sixth to fifth place in the automobile industry.

Oakland executives are making no predictions as to what part of the company may attain by the end of the year. They merely point to the figures. One interesting bit of data shows that when the year 1927 was only three months old, the sales of Oakland and Pontiac cars had reached a total of 74,115 which very nearly equals the sales registered by the company during the entire first five months of 1927.

W. R. Tracy, vice-president in charge of sales, states that recently installed factory facilities now are adequate to take care of the increasing volume of orders.

**Let There Be Light**

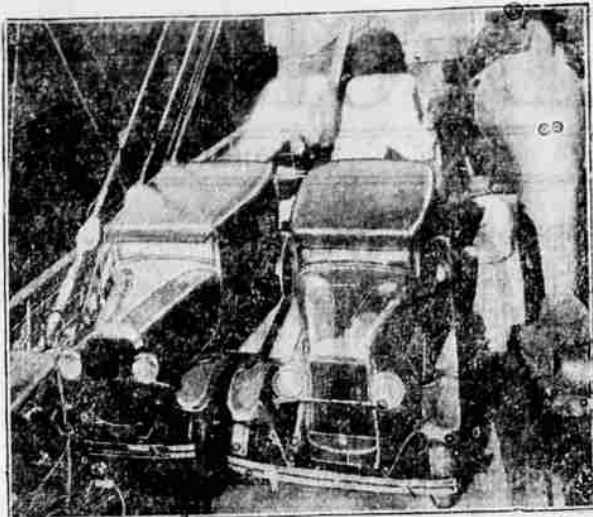
