Hawkins, not knowing that Jefferies had been apprehended, was still busy on the case this forenoon, and wired that he had learned that the

missing man had purchased a railroad ticket at Yreka for Dunsmuir. Car Held in Ashland. Jefferies' car is being held in Ashland with its load of camping equipment and food supplies, the latter of which included two sacks of canned goods, hams and bacon and other eatables. The camping equipment included a tent, pots, pans, frying pan, plates and knives and forks. The load also included all of Jefferies' clothes. The sheriff's office was informed that Jefferies had been on a "trunk" for the past week and that there has been a misunderstanding between Jefferies and the father of the dead boy. The father worked for Jefferies in his service station along the Ashland-Klamath Falls highway. While nothing of a definite nature has been decided, charges of involuntary manslaughter and failure to render aid to an accident victim may be filed against Jefferies.
