FEDERAL DEPUTY AND BROTHER ARE HUNG IN MEXICO

MEXICO CITY, July 11.—(AP)—Executive today printed a dispatch from Durango, state of Mexico, saying that insurgents had hanged Carrasco Santoy and a federal deputy, his brother Carlos and the mayor of the town of Tancitaro.

The presidential bureau announced the receipt of an official report saying 34 insurgents had been killed and a number wounded in two battles with federal troops in the state of Guanajuato.

Two hundred and fifty insurgents, stated to be commanded by Aristid Pedraza, a Catholic priest, were found by federal forces under Captain Diaz at La Concepcion ranch near Leon.

The federal forces followed the fleeing men and ambushed them at Atotonilco, killing 12 more. Four federal soldiers were killed and five wounded in the second encounter.
