

COSTLY PRIZES FOR CONVENTION EXHIBITED HERE

Trophies to be awarded for the best floats entered in the American Legion convention parade to be held in Medford the afternoon of August 4, are on exhibition in the windows of Trophy's and Larry Schalle's jewelry stores.

Each of the 329 silver loving cups will be awarded as first prizes for floats in three different classifications, including the most attractive entry made by a fraternal organization.

A cup will be given for the best float entered in the group from out of town.

For the winning commercial float, one of the largest cups will be awarded.

The American Legion post other than Medford having the largest percentage of their entire membership in the line of march also will be awarded a silver trophy.

A ribbon is offered for second prize in each of the following classifications, with honorable mention to close competitors.

For the most beautifully decorated private car, a first prize of \$25, a second of \$15 and three honorable mention awards will be given.

Every entry in the parade must be a bona fide float or a decorated private car.

Invitations have been sent to all fraternal, patriotic and service organizations in the city asking them to participate in what is planned to be the biggest parade in the history of Medford.

Monday, July 16, a committee will call on as many as possible of the various business and commercial organizations, with personal invitations and explanations of rules.

The prizes will be moved to the chamber of commerce windows next week.
