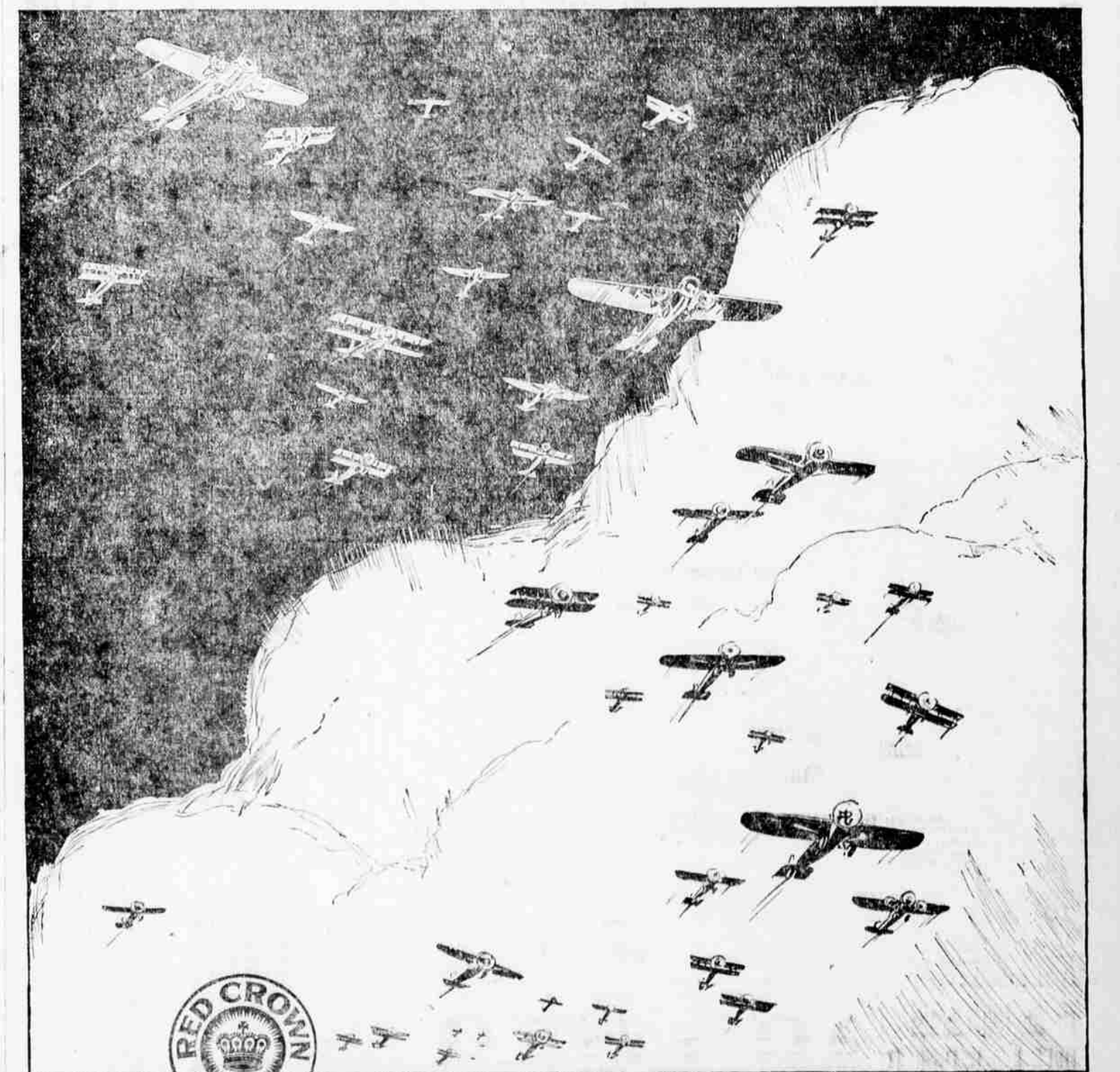
The western branch of the Meaford people, who were in the city for the bandit hunt, are observing the hunt across the line.
