

### GREATER M. CLUB FAILS TO AGREE ON CLUBHOUSE

After a few hours of lively discussion, pro and con, regarding the matter of buying a clubhouse, 30 members of the Greater Medford club at a luncheon meeting today at the Hotel Medford, went on record in favor of tabling the following motion:

That an option on the Luke Ryan home on the corner of Hartlett and Jackson streets for \$8500 be retained, with estimates to be secured on the cost of a new building.

Another meeting of the club will be called in the near future, at which time final action will be taken.

Last year the 25th anniversary of the organization was celebrated, but in all that time the women have never had a clubhouse. In the past there have been as many as 200 members, but at present there are only 50.

There is a great deal of enthusiasm in the club about the proposed quarters, several teas and parties being already tentatively planned for the near future, according to Mrs. E. V. Williams, president of the club.

Just as soon as it became known around town that the women contemplated buying a house, suggestions began coming thick and fast as to the good points of this and that place, until at the meeting today eight houses were brought up for consideration.
