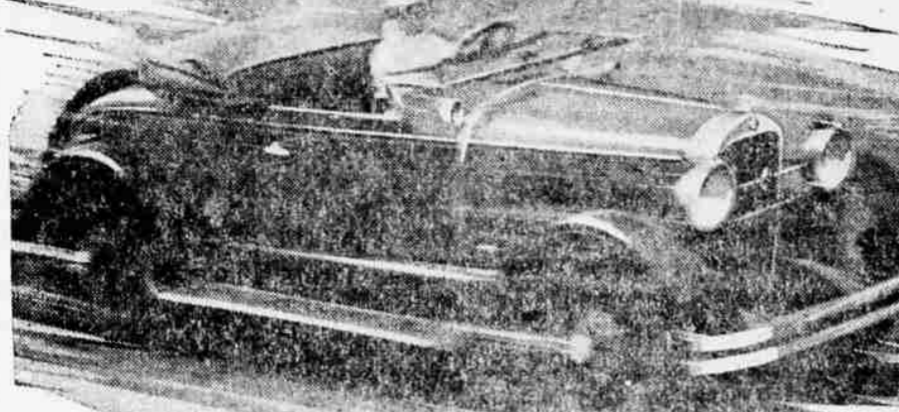

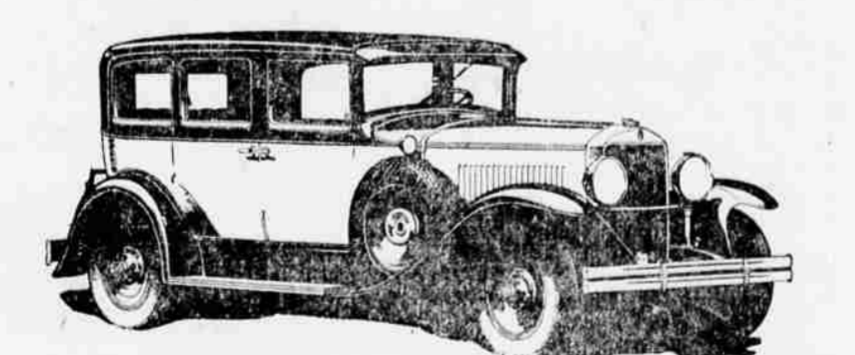

In the sport division controlled by the English company of Willys, we have almost doubled our business this year. "Daring Mr. Willys" visit over-

last year we arranged to put in an assembly plant in Berlin to take care of our business in Germany, and we expect outstanding results to be shown before the end of the year.

Our Swedish organization has also established a separate company and already have begun car assembly at our plant in Gothenburg. In Norway, Sweden and Denmark, the Willys-Overland distributors are enthusiastic, and are doing an increased volume of business as compared with other years.
