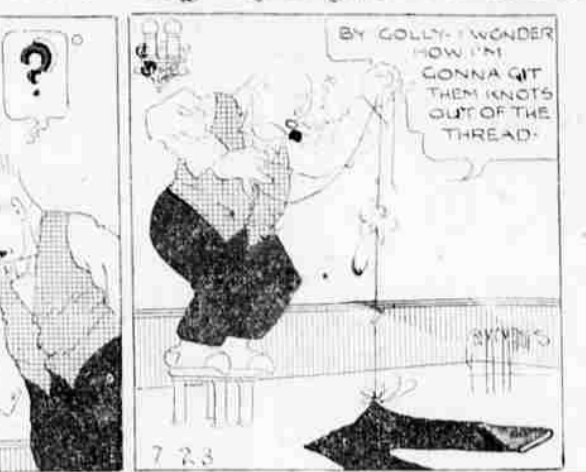

Wall Street Report

NEW YORK, July 22.—(AP)—The stock market turned upward today after an early period of irregularity. Liquidation of several high priced specialties, which sold down 1 to 3 points at the opening, quickly cleared up, and the market resumed its advance under the leadership of the mercantile, copper and southwestern railroad issues.

Call money renewed at 5 1/2 per cent as against 5 per cent last Friday. Banks called about \$5,000,000 in loans during the morning. Although offers of high call money still persist in some quarters, many traders held out hope that the recent decline in market activity and the slump in new bond offerings will ease the credit situation sufficiently so that the present rates will not be materially changed.

The closing was strong. Dealers were more vigorous in the final hour. Montgomery Ward touching another new high with a gain of nearly 8 points and Texas & Pacific also reaching a new peak with a rise of nearly 7. Case Threehinge, which had developed weakness, advanced nearly 15 points in the last of the day. Total sales approximated 1,250,000 shares.
