

### COOLIDGE SNAGS 26 TROUT, 1 OVER THE LEGAL LIMIT

SUPERIOR, Wis., July 27.—(AP)—President Coolidge's success as an angler and Wisconsin game regulations fixing a maximum trout catch per day, appeared to have become entangled when reports came today from the summer white house that the chief executive, in a long fishing day last Wednesday, had made a haul of 26 trout and thereby had exceeded by one the maximum allowed.

On that day Mr. Coolidge started out on the Bruie early in the morning, and with only a brief interruption for luncheon remained fishing until past six o'clock in the evening. The trout were plentiful and he made the most of his opportunities, keeping John Arook, his Indian guide, busy netting his catches. He caught four black spotted, eight rainbow, three brook and eleven brook trout. In addition Larock threw back into the stream eight fish which did not comply with other game regulations. Should the Chippewa guide be counted in as a member of the fishing party, then the maximum catch allowed would be 26 for the day.

Last Wednesday's catch of 26 trout was made by Mr. Coolidge partly on the Bruie proper and partly in some of the connecting lakes. Larock through his intimate knowledge of the stream and of the peculiarities of its trout, was able to paddle Mr. Coolidge to the spots where the fish seemed to rise most plentifully.

### PART INDIAN SHOOT THE GIRL HE LOVED

MILWAUKEE, July 27.—(AP)—Alice Herdgen, 23, today, lay injured, probably fatally and her former suitor, Benjamin Eckert, 27, sought Milwaukee policemen, was in custody.

"She did not like me because I am part Indian," murmured Eckert in explanation of his action, after he surrendered to the authorities. He confessed, police said, to shooting the girl first, then striking her head several times against the floor. At the hospital with a fractured skull her condition was reported serious.

The shooting took place at the home of a friend of the girl.

### SAILOR KILLED BY CUSTOM OFFICER

HOBOKEN, N. J., July 27.—(AP)—Leo Bolze, 39, longshoreman, died just before midnight as a result of a bullet wound. He was shot in the left groin Tuesday by James Macguckin, 26, United States customs guard, on pier two, a government-owned pier.

Macguckin was quoted as saying Bolze had refused to submit to search on leaving the pier and had thrown two bottles of allegedly smuggled whiskey at him, after which he fired. Police said other witnesses denied Bolze had thrown the bottles at Macguckin but had simply thrown the bottles down in the hope of destroying the evidence.

### JAPAN STUNNED BY U. S. SIGNING NEW CHINA PACT

PEKING, China, July 27.—(AP)—Announcement that the United States and China have signed a new treaty created a great stir in Peking, not only in Chinese circles, but in foreign circles as well. The United States has decided to deal independently with China, thus breaking, or at least weakening, the old accord among the powers which has been regarded by the Chinese as the principal stumbling block to nationalist China's aspirations for "equal treaties."

The Japanese legation spokesman said the announcement of the signing had come with startling suddenness, the Japanese considering that the instrument also assured recognition to the Nanking administration, "thus considerably affecting the status of other nations which have vital interests in China as compared with American interests."

LONDON (AP)—A new ultra light automobile with nine horsepower motor, speed of more than 50 miles an hour and mileage better than 45 miles on a gallon, has been put on the British market. It sells at \$575, the lowest price of any vehicle of its kind in Great Britain. Production will be 200 to 300 cars a week, a large output for a half-act factory.

Italy and Balkans linked by Air  
TIRANA, Albania (AP)—Italy has been brought within 10 minutes of the Balkan States. A bi-weekly air service linking Brindisi and Valona, Albania, has been inaugurated, the flight across the Adriatic taking just 10 minutes. This is the first stage in an air-route which will eventually connect Italy and Constantinople via Valona and Salonika.

The new service is operated by an Italian company, the "Adria Aero-Flora," which has replaced the former German company in Albania. It is regarded as further evidence of Mussolini's policy of commercial penetration in Albania and the other Balkan states. The new enterprise is looked upon with disfavor by Jugoslavia, which fears the air line will be used ultimately for Italian military purposes.
