"No, sir! I am going to give it to dad so as to help him pay the next installment on his!"

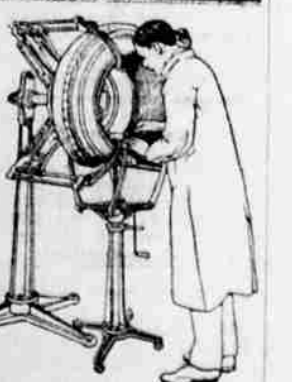
"And now," said the monoeled gentleman who had borrowed a match from the traffic cop, "I suppose you like to know who I am?"

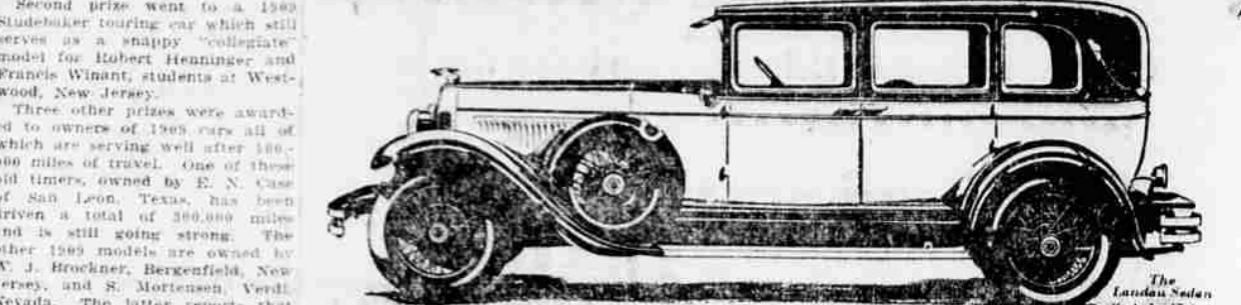
