NEW NAVAL PACT PRESENTED TO UNITED STATES

LONDON, July 31.—(AP)—Details of a Franco-British naval compromise, mentioned by Sir Austen Chamberlain, foreign secretary, in the House of Commons yesterday, are said to have been called to the British ambassador at Washington, where they are expected to be presented today or tomorrow.

A government spokesman told the Associated Press today that a compromise had been reached between the two methods of naval armament reduction on which previous conferences have split, namely limitation by total tonnage favored by France, and by categories, favored by Great Britain.

Under the total or global tonnage system no restriction is placed upon the types of vessel to be included under the total tonnage allotted to any country, while under the category system, the total tonnage of the various types of war vessels is agreed upon.

The question of submitting construction is definitely involved in the compromise, the spokesman said.

In the event that the United States and other nations accept the compromise, another meeting of the preparatory commission on disarmament of the League of Nations will be called to consider the next step.

The United States and other nations reject the compromise, a meeting will be called to consider modifications of it. The compromise will not become effective until the major powers agree to it.

The government spokesman carefully explained that the naval compromise in no sense is an agreement as to definite reductions. It is essentially a "formula of principles" on which reductions can be made. What those principles are, however, the government is unwilling to state at present.

TILLAMOOK SHOWS 3 MEN KILLED BY EXPLOSION ON N. Y. STEAMER

TILLAMOOK, Ore., July 31.—(AP)—Members of the American Institute of cooperation continued their state tour from here on to McMinnville, Dundee, Springbrook and Portland today, they carried with them the picture of a prosperous farming country and a rich cooperative association in one of the most famous centers of that type of farm marketing.

A sea food dinner, given last night by the Tillamook County Creamery association, ended in a general educational discussion among Wisconsin dairy and cheese representatives and local leaders, in which the middle-west men sought to find the reason for the consistent premium price for Tillamook products.

The local answer was standardized inspection, bringing standardized quality, advertising, and honest dealing, both with growers and dealers through literally 100 per cent cooperation.

This morning the party, which is the guest of the Oregon cooperative council, was taken through the valley of leading farms and cheese factories led by W. D. Pine, county agent and Carl Haberlach, for 25 years manager of the creamery association.

Tonight a banquet is scheduled for Portland, followed by a trip to Hood River Wednesday.

CHICAGO GUNMAN SLAYER SHOT DOWN BEFORE LAW ACTS

CHICAGO, July 31.—(AP)—Benny Zion, indicted by the special election frauds grand jury on nine separate counts for complicity in the slaying of Octavius Granady, 20th ward candidate for committeeman, was found shot to death today in an alley back of a west side saloon.

Zion, found partly buried under a pile of refuse, had been shot four times, and police said the shooting apparently had taken place in the saloon, the slayers dragging Zion out to the alley, where a policeman found his body.

NEW BARBER LAW IN OREGON UPHELD

SALEM, Ore., July 31.—(AP)—The state barber law passed by the 1927 legislature, which among other things, imposes on barbers certain educational requirements, was upheld by a recent court decision in Portland, the attorney general's office reports.

M. Hornstein, proprietor of the Oregon Barber college, sued the state board of barber examiners to restrain the board from enforcing the law against his school. He claimed the law unconstitutional, declaring it cut down the enrollment in the school because it requires barbers to have an eighth grade education and an elementary knowledge of chemistry and anatomy.

CANADIAN BANK BANDITS ESCAPE TO NORTH DAKOTA

GRAND FORK, N. D., July 31.—(AP)—North Dakota officers today searched for bandits who took \$27,000 from Winnipeg, Minn., bank passengers, fled across the international boundary and disarmed two pursuing officers near Lawton, N. D. yesterday.

After shutting the windshield of the pursuing car, three of the four bandits covered the officers, disarming them, disconnected the ignition wires of their car and took five minutes of waiting to enable them to continue their flight.

Five Canadian officers were in the neighborhood of Lawton today aiding the search for the four men, the last trace of whom was had when they halted a car in which were William Heunberry, United States immigration inspector, and Lester Edgington, provincial policeman.

The two officers stopped their car when they were cut by flying glass. A sawedoff shotgun was used in the attack on them.
