

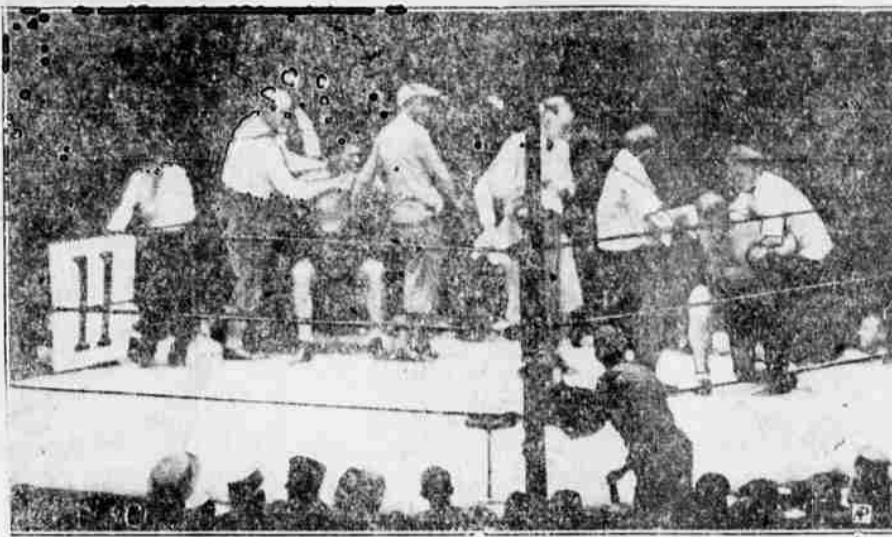

#### SECONDS CARRY HEENEV TO CORNER AFTER TENTH

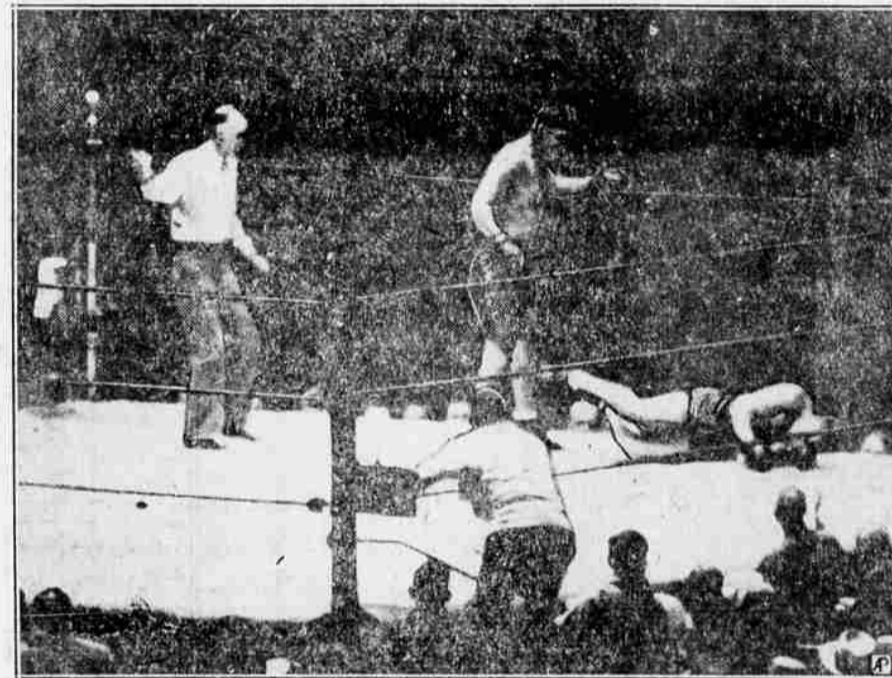

**Italian Farmers Aided**  
ROME—(AP) Loans totalling 20,000,000 lire—well over \$1,000,000—will soon be available to Italian farmers seriously wounded in the World war. The funds will enable them to buy land, farm implements and the like. The loans, granted at low interest rates, will run 25 years.

**Canada Exporting Cars**  
WASHINGTON—(AP) Canada has broken all previous records for exporting automobiles and trucks, the department of commerce reports. In May the Canadian industry increased its exports 50 percent to a new high mark of \$2,628,934 for the month. Australia is the chief market.
