

U. S. WINS 1ST RACE ON TRACK

Barbutti of Syracuse In Winning 400 Meter Race Saves the United States From Goose Egg In Olympics. — Harvard Crew Back In Running By Beating Japs.

OLYMPIC STADIUM, AMSTERDAM, Aug. 3.—(AP)—America won its first and only track event of the 1928 Olympic games today as stout-hearted Ray Barbutti fought his way to the 400-meter championship after a spectacular battle with the pick of the world's quarter-milers, which wound up in a hair-raising finish.

Finland started the day with another impressive victory, Willie Ritola carrying off the 5000-meter crown with his teammate and rival, Pavo Nurmi, second and the only American to finish, Leo Lemmond, fourth. But in the other final on the day's program Barbutti ran the Stars and Stripes up the victory pole by finishing just eight inches ahead of James Hall of Canada in a desperate drive for the line.

It was the sixth men's championship won for the United States thus far in the game, but it was the most welcome of all, the other five victories were gained in the field events while foreign foot-racers ran away with all the cinder path laurels in sight.

Barbutti, former football player at Syracuse and one of the most courageous competitors in the history of track, went into the race to save this 400-meter classic from the wreckage and he came through although the great field arrayed against him forced him to cover the distance in 47 4-5 seconds, just one-fifth of a second behind the Olympic record. His final lunge for the tape sent him sprawling to the cinders, but it brought him victory.

The point score for the 17 men's track and field events completed, including the two which took place today, follows, the totals being computed under the unofficial but general system of awarding ten points for first, five for second, four for third, three for fourth, two for fifth and one for sixth.

Harvard Comes Back. ROTTERDAM, Holland, Aug. 2.—(AP) The United States won three races and lost one in the Olympic rowing regatta today, depulicating yesterday's performance. The Harvard four with coxswain got back into the running by beating the Japanese eight, but the Penn. A. C. pair from Philadelphia, with its boy coxswain, Tommy Mack, lost a close race to the Italians by a half length.

Other American victories over the double scullers' triumph over the Swiss pair in the fastest time of any of the five heats in this event of 7 minutes 45 4-5 seconds, and an impressive win by the Penn. Barge club four without coxswain, after trailing the German shell for 100 meters.

Losing the first race does not definitely eliminate a crew from this competition and the double shell steered by Macy will have a chance to get a new start tomorrow when today's losers will row among themselves. By this same method Harvard was able to wipe out its defeat yesterday by the Germans with its victory over the Japanese and begin all over again.

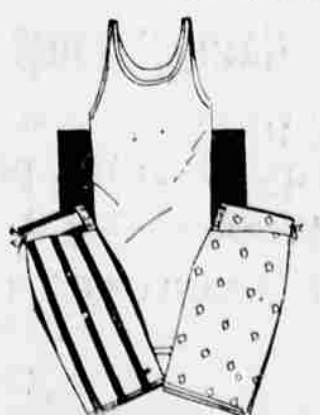
