

# BEER BARONS OF CHICAGO BARRED FROM THE RACES

CHICAGO, Aug. 10.—(AP)—Terry Druggan and Frankie Lake, notorious Chicago "beer barons," who are reported to have purchased a controlling interest in Arlington park, the city's largest and most fashionable racing plant, through a dummy syndicate, face banishment from all American tracks.

Their difficulty with track officials centered about a free-for-all fist fight in the paddock of Hawthorne race track yesterday, in which Druggan is alleged to have menaced a stable owner, jockey and trainer with a pistol. Officials of the Illinois Turf association indicate the two will be barred from all tracks.

The fight took place when Druggan struck H. J. Jenkins, California stable owner, for claiming one of his horses, Morocco, in a race Wednesday. As Jenkins arose, he was floored and kicked, witnesses said. Jockey Arthur Pendergrass, who weighs but 165 pounds, then came to Jenkins' rescue. He was getting the better of Druggan when Lake entered. Lake struck Thomas Hunt, a former jockey, who was about to help Jenkins and Pendergrass.

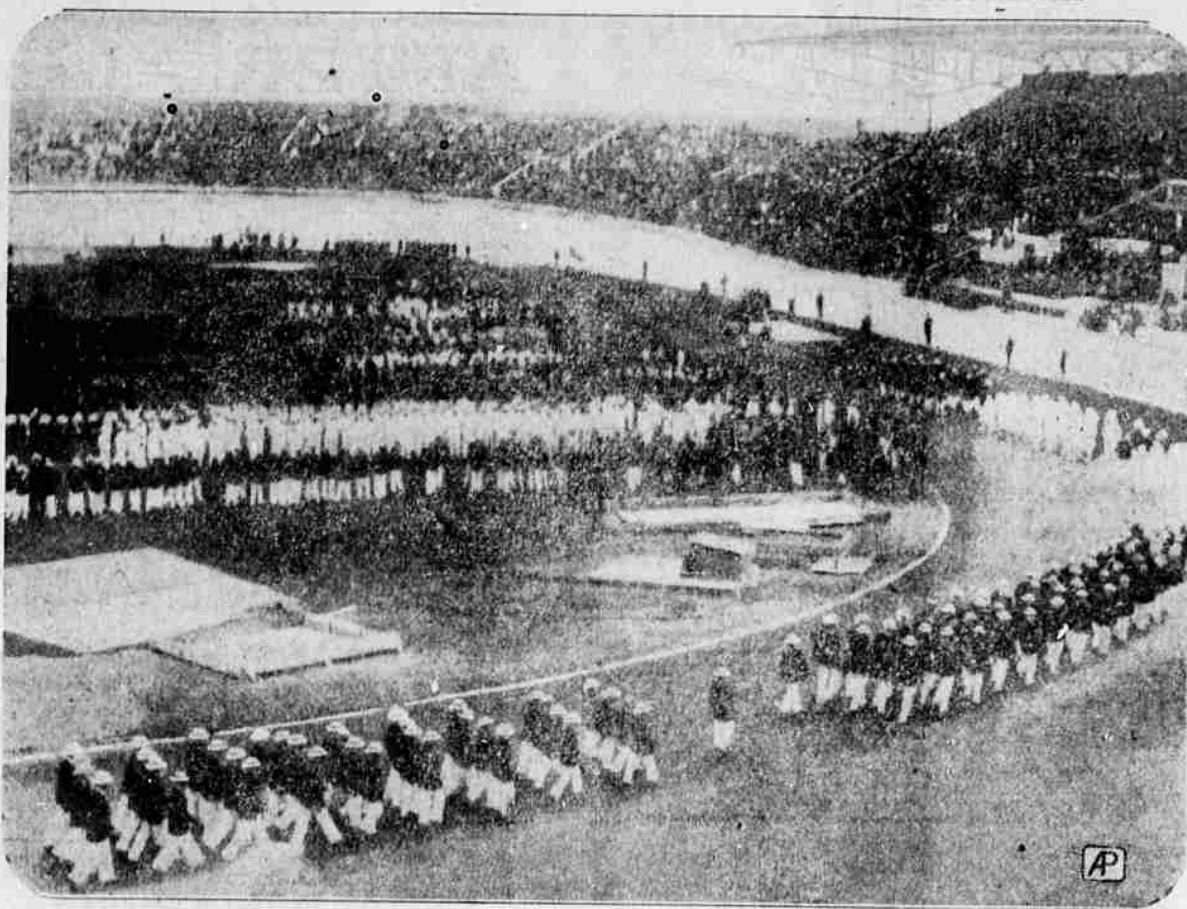
Reading that he was getting the worst of his fist fight with the jockey, witnesses said, Druggan whipped out his pistol, waving it menacingly. Pendergrass ran away and returned with some lead weights and began to shower Druggan and Lake with the missiles. With his supply of lead gone, the witnesses added, Pendergrass ran, while Jenkins and Hunt followed. Druggan, the jockey said, caught him later and threatened to "bump me off."

Presiding Steward Joseph A. Murphy and associate stewards immediately began an investigation of the fight. Two horses, which ran under the silks of Druggan's stable, were ordered scratched for their afternoon races and drastic action was promised.

KANSAS CITY, Aug. 10.—(AP)—Jerome Walsh of Kansas City, a lawyer who represented William E. Hickman in his trial for the murder of Marian Parker, said today his associate in California would present a petition for a writ of error to Justice George Sutherland of the Ninth judicial circuit. Justice Sutherland is on vacation in California from Washington.

If denied the petition the writ will be presented to one after another of the U. S. supreme court justices, Walsh said.

If a majority of the nine members refuse the writ, no further legal action would be possible.

## POLICE SCORED FOR BUNGLING HORROR CRIME

CHICAGO, Aug. 10.—(AP)—A charge that Evanston police bungled their investigation into the slaying of Miss Jenny Constance, school teacher, has been made by Detective Frederick Bennett, fingerprint expert.

All articles connected with the crime including the iron pipe used to club Miss Constance to death were so handled before he was called as to eliminate possibility of working out fingerprint clues, he said.

The handling of Miss Constance, with its contents missing, and her vanity case were found last night near the scene of the killing in front of a home where John Burke

Evanston police, baffled by lack of definite clues and pressed by demands of citizens to apprehend the slayer, today pieced together their scant evidence and redoubled their man hunt.
