

CALIF. APPLES  
SELL, PORTLAND,  
AT HIGH PRICE

PORTLAND, Ore., Aug. 11.—(AP)—Trading was active on local wholesale produce markets today and prices were generally firm. Local dry pack lettuce was about steady, with yesterday's figures at \$1.25 to \$1.50.

Tomatoes were still rather scarce and brought around \$1.25 per crate for No. 1 stock, while No. 2 average went around 75c. Beans and peas were higher, although supplies appeared to be about normal. Beans went to the trade at 6 and 7c per pound, while peas brought a cent more.

Domestic local red Gravenstein apples were beginning to arrive today and sold freely around \$1.50 per box. Other varieties of local apples ranged from 75c to \$1.50. California Gravensteins topped the market at \$2.25.

Potato receipts were heavy and trading fairly active at steady prices, ranging from \$1.25 to \$1.75 per sack, depending on variety and grade.

Except for a weaker tone in hog and heavy poultry and dressed meat prices were unchanged. Receipts of veal and pork were fairly good, but demand was good and no accumulation to speak of was reported.

Butter and egg prices were steady and unchanged at yesterday's figures. Receipts yesterday were: Butter, 17,728 cases, 202 cases. Storage holdings were: Butter, 599,058 pounds; eggs, 1,034 cases.

TWINS REFUSE TO CONFIRM REPORT OF LOVE TANGLE

NEW YORK, Aug. 11.—(AP)—One of them is said to have fallen in love and wants to marry. The 17-year-old girls, joined together since birth, are under observation in a hospital here preparatory to an operation to separate them.

Mary and Margaret Gibbs, the so-called "Siamese Twins," are daughters of Mr. and Mrs. John R. Gibbs of Holyoke, Mass. They are joined by a cartilaginous band at the base of the spine.

Dr. Francis P. Weston, who has charge of the case, declined any comment other than to say that the proposed operation was very hazardous.

All previous attempts but one to separate "Siamese Twins" were said by surgeons to have proved unsuccessful. The one successful operation was performed several years ago in Mexico and in that case one of the twins died. Surgeons explain that "Siamese Twins" usually have some vital connecting link, such as a joint circulatory system or spinal system.

The Gibbs twins came into public notice last fall when one of them developed a severe cold followed by an attack of bronchitis and for a time was critically ill. The cold, it was said, did not contract the disease.

The report that Margaret wished to marry and therefore desired to be separated from her sister could not be confirmed at the private hospital where they were taken on Thursday. The twins could not be seen and it was said they had had no visitors.

The two girls recently have been appearing on exhibition at Coney Island and have made several appearances in vaudeville. They are accomplished pianists and play golf and dance.

TOURISTS' BOY KILLED BY AUTO AT GRANTS PASS

GRANTS PASS, Ore., Aug. 11.—(AP) Richard Ellis, 9, son of Mr. and Mrs. Chas. Ellis of Walla Walla, Wash., was fatally injured yesterday afternoon in an automobile accident on the Pacific highway, 2 1/2 miles north of Grants Pass. The Ellis car had been stopped at the side of the highway and the boy jumped out and ran around the rear of the car starting across the highway without looking for approaching cars. An automobile driven by C. N. Harned of Seattle, struck him, cutting his neck, badly and fracturing the skull. The boy died in a Roseburg hospital at 5 o'clock this morning. The Seattle driver was not held as the parents stated the boy was at fault in falling to look out for cars.

ROSEBURG, Ore., Aug. 11.—(AP) Richard P. Ellis, 9 year old son of Mr. and Mrs. Charles Ellis of Walla Walla, died at a hospital here today from injuries received last night when he was struck by a car driven by C. N. Harned of Seattle. Ellis had stopped his car at a camp ground near Glendale to permit his two sons to see a lynx displayed there.

As the machine came to a stop, Richard jumped out and darted across the road squarely in front of Harned's car. He was struck by the fender and received a fractured skull.

He was rushed to the hospital here, but died this morning. The body is to be taken to Walla Walla for burial. Ellis and his family were returning from a trip to Long Beach, California.

Oliver Stephenson was held on a vagrancy charge with bail set at \$2500. Victor Matthews, of Webster City, Iowa, a visitor, who lost \$100 in a poker game just before the raid by officers, was held as a material witness.

Police said \$50,000 worth of Mexican money, purchased for 25 cents, was used by the gang in its operations.
