

BARTLETT PEARS SELLING WELL IN PORTLAND

PORTLAND, Ore., Aug. 14.—Seasonal fruits and melons were in profusion on local wholesale produce markets today and trading was fairly active, considering the cool weather.

Some unusually desirable crates of honeydew and Persian melons were offered, the former going to the trade at \$1.50 per crate, while Persians brought \$2.00, ice cream melons sold at 12c per pound, casabas at 2 1/2c and 2 3/4c, watermelons from 2 1/2c to 2 3/4c, and cantaloupes from \$1.50 to \$2.00 per crate, depending on size and variety.

Grapes were more plentiful and of several varieties. Seedless grapes moved well at 75c to \$1.00 per lug box, while black muskats brought around \$1.00. Malagas topped the market around \$1.50 to \$1.75 per lug.

High quality huckleberries from the Mt. Adams district were also being offered and sold freely at 17c per pound. Other varieties were cheaper at 15c. Blackberries sold, from \$1.00 to \$1.25 per crate, depending on quality.

Bartlett pears were plentiful and in good demand at \$2.50 to \$2.75 per box. Peaches continued to move well at \$6 to \$7.00 per box for Elberta, Crawford and similar varieties, while the large J. H. Haise brought as high as \$1.50 per box.

ALBANY, Ore., Aug. 14.—(AP) Mrs. John Matson, wife of a farmer near Halsey, reported receiving a second threatening note demanding \$5000, and officers are investigating to determine whether it had any connection with a note found recently in the Matson mail box demanding \$5000.
