GRANTS PASS, Ore., Aug. 15.—(P)—A Los Angeles mother dozed for a few moments today as the car in which she was riding with her year and a half old babe over the Pacific highway, bound for Portland. As she slept, her babe crawled from her basket and over the side of the car, falling to the pavement unobserved.

The car went a mile and the mother awoke. The driver turned and a frantic search resulted. Meanwhile, a service station operator had picked up the infant and had entrusted it to the care of a passing motorist who brought the child to a doctor in Grants Pass. CLAIM CRATER L. ROAD BEING HURT BY LOG TRUCKS

PORTLAND, Ore., Aug. 15.—(P)—Hearing on a petition for a toll road between Umatilla and Wallowa, which a company proposes to build, was interrupted by the state highway commission late yesterday by W. K. Lynch, engineer representing the United States bureau of public roads, said that granting the permit would probably deprive the highway department of federal aid.

The highway commission received a number of identical communications from chambers of commerce, asking that \$2,000,000 bonds be sold for completion of the Roosevelt highway. The commission expressed the belief that about twice that amount would be needed in view of costly bridges necessary on the route. No action was taken on the matter.

Contract for a bridge across the Dochowas at Maupin was not awarded, the checks for the two low bidders being held for the present. Bids were so high for surfacing the Reedsport section of the Oregon Coast highway that they were rejected.
