

TILLAMOOK TO FIGHT LOGGING TRUCK DAMAGE

PORTLAND, Ore., Aug. 15.—(AP) Tillamook is planning to curb the use of highways by heavy logging trucks that have been damaging the highway, the state highway commission was informed today by County Judge J. H. Van Jaarsveld, chairman of the commission, and scanned the Tillamook delegation that something must be done to stop the destruction of highways by trucks which violate the load laws.

Judge Bell said a statute was being built to test loads and that traffic officers would be on hand to see that the load law was enforced.

The Tillamook delegation came in to have the highway commission take action on a proposed new bridge over the Trask river two miles south of Tillamook. This bridge will cost \$50,000, but the new right-of-way to it will be \$100,000, making this new road \$150,000 and paying \$70,000.

It was announced that with uncertainty as to auto license laws in the November election, the commission could not take any action other than to agree to reconstruct the old bridge.

Linn county was given all the time it will need to pay the state \$10,000 due for road work. It was also stated that as soon as the question of finances was cleared, the state would proceed to build that section of the Roosevelt highway between Seal Rocks and Waldport.

Two Harney county delegations appeared, asking the commission to designate their proposed routes for the new main highway into Harney.

The commission opened bids today for surfacing the Roadport section of Roosevelt highway and the Lebanon-Shaw's Hill section of the Stanton highway, and the bridge over Deschutes river at Maupin.
