

APPLES SELLING HIGH AS PEARS PORTLAND MART

PORTLAND, Ore., Aug. 15.—(AP) Although California Elberta peaches were about out of market, Yakima Elbertas were arriving and fetching around \$1.25 per box for good sizes. Oregon Crawfords were also in good supply and moved well at \$1.00-1.15 per box. California Lovells were also offered freely and sold around 90c-1.00. Large J. H. Hale peaches from California were becoming scarce but Yakima Hales were offered here and there at \$1.50 per box for the large table sizes. Apples were mostly plentiful, mostly green, both from California and Oregon. The southern variety brought \$2.00 to \$2.25 per box while local offerings, which were mostly jumble packed and uncrated, sold around \$1.00-1.25 per box. Crab apples were in good supply but demand was small. Local Bartlett pears, rather green, were beginning to show and sold around \$1.75 per box, a few at \$2.00. California Bartletts went mostly at \$2.00. Except for an increase of 1/2c in the quotation on sube firsts, other prices were unchanged today. Standard first eggs were a cent lower at 21c per dozen. Other grades were steady. Yesterday's receipts were: Butter, 10,145 pounds; eggs, 585 cases. Storage holdings were: Butter, 599,227 pounds; eggs, 81,000 cases. Veal receipts were light and the price firm on the dressed meat market while lambs were in large supply and drab. No price changes were quoted. Poultry prices were likewise unchanged although heavy hens were scarce and the market firm. Leghorns were plentiful. Tomatoes were decidedly weaker in the vegetable division, best offerings being down about 15c and selling at 90c to \$1.10 per box of 18 to 20 pounds. Potatoes and dry onions showed no change in prices.
