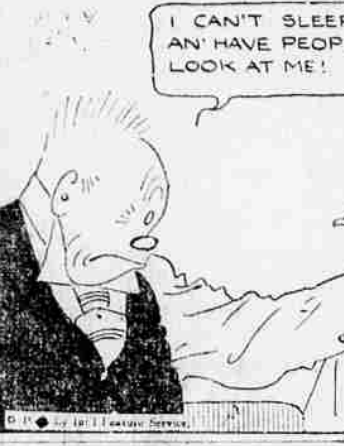

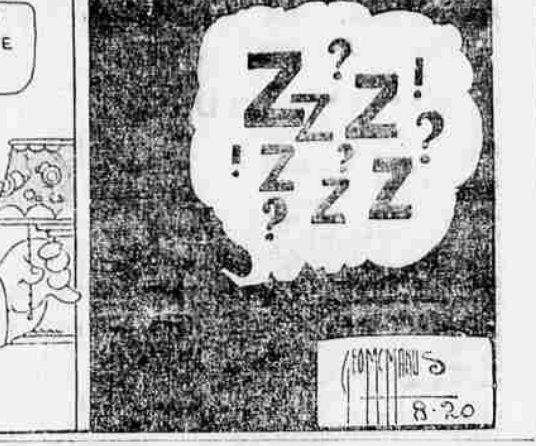

CALIF. APPLES TOP PORTLAND'S FRUIT MARKET

Wholesale produce markets were rather quiet today with prices generally steady at Saturday's closing figures.
There was a car of sweet tokyo grapes which were of unusual quality and went to the trade at \$2.50 per box.
A carload of Alentons was received but no price quotation had been set. Alentons are essentially a juice grape. Zinfandels are expected to start coming in a week or so.
Pres. hprunes of very fine flavor were among early offerings and moved out well at 60c per 15 pound box. Plums were plentiful at \$1.50 per crate.
Most wholesale houses were rather short on peaches, most of the day's supply being early Crawford's from The Dalles going to the trade at 90c@95c per box. Some small offerings of Yukima peaches were quoted around \$1.00 per box but retailers were loathe to pay the price and movement was slow. A few J. H. Hales were still to be had but supplies were light and the price firm around \$1.50 per box.
Tomatoes were in heavy supply and cheap at 60c@65c per 18 pound box for first class stock. Inferior and number 2 grade stuff were sold as low as 45c@40c per box.
Lettuce was likewise in good supply and prices were steady. Beans and peas were plentiful and went at 55c@6c and 50c@10c respectively.
Apples were in large supply and went at a wide range of prices depending on grade and variety. California gravensteins topped the market around \$2.25 per box with Hood River gravensteins about the same at \$2.15@2.25. Faced and filled grades of gravensteins sold all the way from \$1.00 to \$1.50 depending on quality. Small offerings of Oregon waxens averaged around \$1.15 per box. Crab apples were plentiful at 75c@81.5c depending on size and quality.
There were plenty of melons of all varieties and prices were generally easy.
