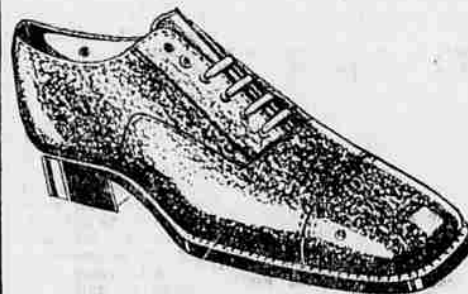
YANKEE GOLFERS HAVE BAD LUCK WALKER CUP PLAY
