3 NEW FIRES IN COUNTY REPORTED UNDER CONTROL

Three new fires, two in the Applegate section of the Crater national forest, and one on state land broke out yesterday afternoon, all of which are reported as under control but still being patrolled.

The most serious of this trio of blazes was one of supposed incendiary origin which burned over 200 acres of grass and brush in the Applegate section above the Wm. Matney ranch and which started about 1 p. m. although now under control was still being patrolled by 11 fire fighters today.

The other national forest fire in the Applegate section started on Poormans creek about 3 p. m. and before coming under control burned over an area of one-eighth acre in brush, grass and logs. This fire is thought to have originated from some careless smoker.

Harry Reed, a director in the trans-continental passenger air line to begin operations next May between Los Angeles and New York City next spring, will leave by ambulance tomorrow morning for his home in Portland, after having sustained a broken leg last Sunday evening at the Harry Scott and Nona Tucker summer home on the side of Prospect. Reed received the broken limb when he jumped six or eight feet from the cabin porch, according to late reports.

movement to place him in the White House.

He made it plain that while he was concerned with his own campaign, he also was determined to keep the democrats in control of the government of New York. He urged the state leaders to "get actively on the job" and "preach the duty of resignation to every body that comes within the circle of our influence."

He said he was convinced, if he sized up the sentiment of the people of the state correctly, that they do not want a change in party administration.
