28 BOYS OF 61 TO END ANNUAL REUNION TODAY

Southern Oregon Veterans Gather at Ashland—To Meet Next Year at Grants Pass for One-Day Session

Grants Pass will be the location of next year's annual reunion of the Southern Oregon Soldiers and Sailors' Reunion association and instead of three days, it will be held only for one day, according to a decision reached at this morning's business session of the association, held at Ashland, where this year's reunion has been in progress since Wednesday, with 28 veterans in attendance.

The present attendance is four less than it was in 1927 and is attributed to the death of two and the inability of two others to attend, because of sickness. In the minds of the veterans, it will be only a few years until reunions will be a thing of the past, as a result of the rapidly changing ranks of the soldiers who fought for the preservation of the union over 60 years ago.

A picnic dinner followed the business session this forenoon and was attended by all the veterans and nearly 100 W. R. C. and Daughters of Veterans members.

Yesterday afternoon the W. H. Harrison W. R. C. of Central Point and the James Littrell corps of Gold Hill furnished an interesting patriotic program, made up of songs, recitations and other patriotic numbers. A band concert was presented last evening in the Lithia Park, where tents have been pitched by a number of the more hardy of the veterans, who still enjoy camp life. Today's program is being given by the General Logan corps and Daughters of Veterans of Grants Pass.

Last Wednesday the veterans were guests at a watermelon feed made possible through the courtesy of Ashland merchants and by a treat of peaches furnished by Comrade G. O. Van Natta of Ashland.

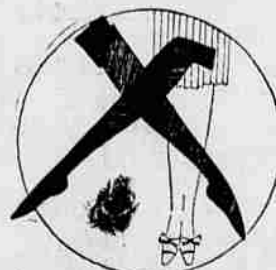
