FIRE HAZARD IN VALLEY INCREASED BY LONG DROUGHT

The direct heat of the sun the past two days has been tempered by the smoke which has filled the valley and other sections of the county the past two days.

This together with the fact that not a drop of rain has fallen for 32 days past, making the forests and other rural lands excessively dry, and the very low humidity prevailing, makes a dangerous fire menace.

The Crater National forest lookouts are unable to locate fires because of the heavy smoke. A passerby, however, discovered a fire in the Sardinia creek section about five miles north of Gold Hill at 8 o'clock last night...

The only other fire in the valley is that several miles northwest of Ashland, which is described elsewhere in this paper.
