

A MINISTER OF FRANCE KILLED IN AIR CRASH

Bokanowski, Youngest Man in Cabinet, Flies As Answer to Press Critics—Identified By His Watch—Had Brilliant War Record

PARIS, Sept. 2.—(AP)—A sudden nose dive of an airplane and its crash in flames have robbed France of her youngest cabinet member, Maurice Bokanowski, minister of commerce and aviation.

Four others, Gabriel Hanla, pilot; Jean Vidal, mechanic; Henri Williams, radio operator; and Edouard Lefranc, general secretary of an airplane company, also perished in the crash near Tou.

Just previous to boarding the plane, Bokanowski, while chatting with General de Portny and Captain Houbert, said, "Newspapermen insist that I never fly, that I take all possible precautions, even when I approach a plane standing still. You see," he continued as he jumped into the cabin of the plane, "an airplane trip has no terrors for me." Five minutes later he was dead.

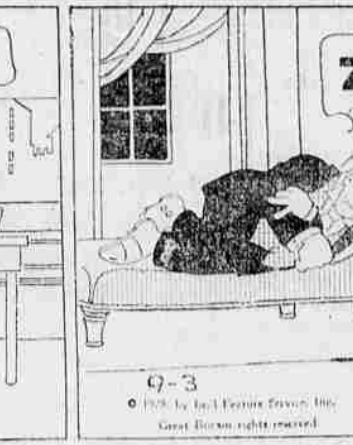
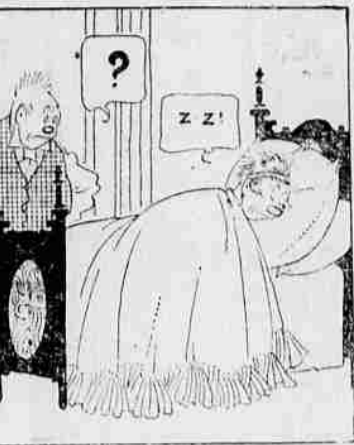
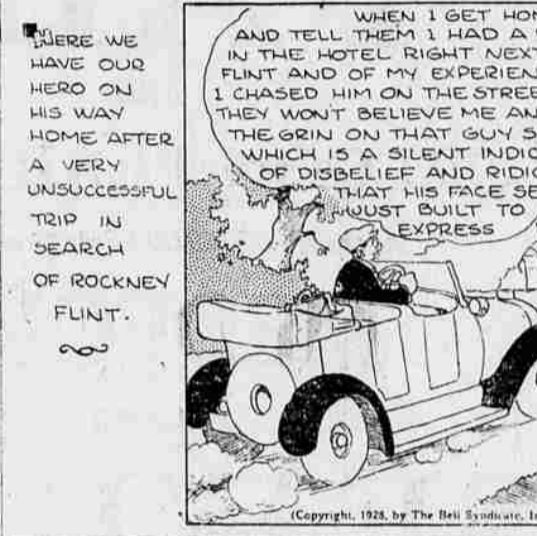
Bokanowski spent Saturday at the country house of Premier Poincare at Compiègne, where he attended an informal meeting of the cabinet, celebrating the premier's 68th birthday and also the second anniversary of the formation of the national union cabinet.
