

ATTENDANCE AT CRATER LAKE ON STEADY INCREASE

That Crater Lake is becoming more popular every year is evidenced by the increased travel up to Monday night, September 3, the total attendance in the park was 169,329 people and there had been 20,594 cars.

Up to the same date last year the attendance was 76,296; cars, 21,594, a gain of 93,033 people and 928 cars.

The largest attendance at the park, prior to this year, was in 1926, when there were 56,919.

Of the total of 169,329, only 10,077 entered the park by stage from all entrances, showing a large majority of the people who are seeing the parks do so in their own autos.

The attendance by auto and entrances was as follows:

Cars from all entrances at night are registered at Anna Springs.

Of those entering by stage, 325 were from Medford and 679 from Klamath Falls.

The greatest attendance this year on any one day was Sunday, August 19, when the number was 2067, next largest, July 22, attendance 2961; third largest attendance was 2629 on September 2, last Sunday.

The lodge closes September 20. The roads are fine now to the lake and although considerable smoke from the forest fires settles in the bowl of the lake, it is a fine time to visit this world wonder.

This is the first year anyone connected with the park remembers the first of September arriving without a rain or snow storm during the park season.

COUNTY TEACHERS MEET SATURDAY

High schools which will begin sessions next week in Jackson county include Phoenix, Gold Hill, Ashland, Sams Valley, Prospect, Harte Falls and Central Point, which takes in the majority of such schools in the county. Several high schools, including Medford, began this week, in addition to a large number of rural schools.

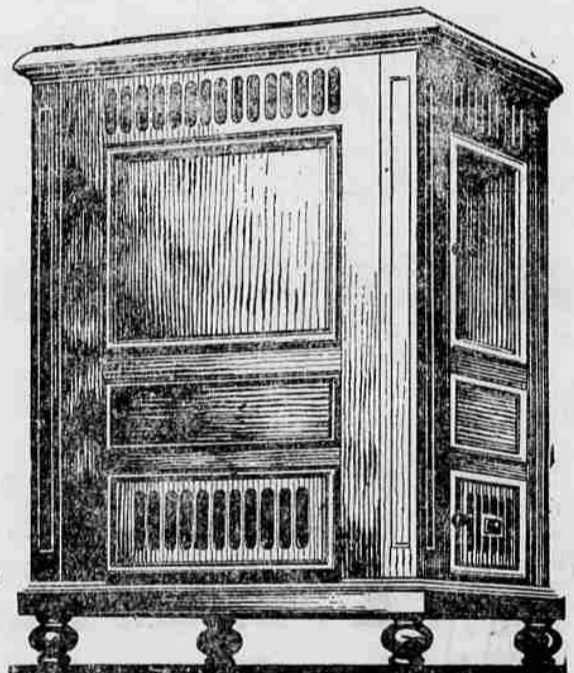
