

FIRST DAY'S RACE PROGRAM AT FAIR HAS NINE EVENTS

The track program for the four days of the Jackson county fair and Oregon Fair Show, which opens Wednesday, will show some of the fastest horses in action that have ever competed on southern Oregon race tracks.

The selection of judges includes such well known local men as Wilbur Ahploh, J. J. Murphy, Nick Young, Scott Wolf and Raf Moran.

Over 70 head of horses are now at the track and more arrivals are expected before noon tomorrow. In addition to the thoroughbred racing stock, there are relay ponies, trick horses and chariot racers from the Frank Roach string of Enterprise, Ore.

The track in its better condition than ever before and with the fine lineup of horses, which the fair board has been able to secure, there is every indication that fast time will feature the events. Entries will close at 6 p. m. of the day previous to the race for which owners wish to list their mounts and programs of each day's entrants and jockeys will be available for the grandstand crowds. The races will begin promptly at 1:30 each day.

SERGEANT ROONEY VISITS IN CITY

"Everybody knows me, I'm Sergeant Major Rooney," explained a military appearing man who arrived in Medford last evening from Portland while en route to San Francisco and other points south. He is stopping here just long enough to introduce a new automatic pencil, which, said he, can write in 17 languages and 22 different colors, a wonderful little pencil.

"I arrived in your fair little city last night with an army colonel, who had a chauffeur," he continued as he spoke with an Irish brogue. "I'm not Irish, but I was born in New York before I went across the water to make Ireland my home, but I fought with the Australians in Gallipoli against the Turks in the World War. I was under shell fire for two years before we were finally able to withdraw from the withering fire of our enemies."

"I was wounded six times and still carry a piece of shrapnel in my head and see there, you can see where a machine gun bullet went through my neck. I was also gassed, the effects of which I still suffer and at times I suffer from shell shock. In fact, I feel safe in saying that I am a disabled war veteran," he concluded.

Sergeant Rooney displayed numerous credentials and identification papers, indicating him to be a paid up member in several patriotic organizations. He also carried a letter of introduction from the governor of Utah and he said he was in Medford four years ago to make a speech before local legionnaires.
