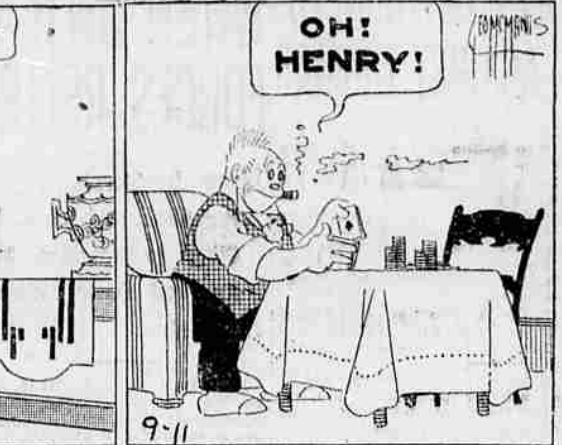

NEW YORK, Sept. 11.—(AP) Wild speculation for the advance was resumed in today's stock market after an early period of irregularity. Extreme gains in the pool specialties ranged from 2 to 14 points, with at least two score issues pushed into new high ground for the year or longer. Uneasiness over the credit situation, which accounted for much of the early selling, disappeared when word was passed around that a plentiful supply of call money was available at the renewal figure of 7 1/2 per cent. The closing was strong. Early lagards burst into prominence in late dealings as pool operations brought up the rear guard in a further attack on the short position. Coppers were accumulated on an increasing scale. Amacoda going above 77 into new high ground, while American Smelting, Greens-Cannana and Calumet & Arizona rose 3 to 5 points. Gains of 5 to 10 points also were made by Wright Aero, Union Carbide, National Tea and Standard Milling. Total sales were around 4,000,000 shares.
