NOTED WOMAN, HOOVER'S AIDE, HERE ON VISIT

A distinguished visitor in this city last night was Mrs. Robert J. Burdette, elderly widow of one of the Pacific coast's most famous humorists, and herself well-known internationally as an organizer of women's clubs and at present one of the most active political campaigners for Herbert Hoover for president. Mrs. Burdette was accompanied by Mrs. Webster Merrifield and their chauffeur, and from here they went to San Francisco in preparation for the opening meeting of the California state republican campaign which will be in session at the Palace hotel tomorrow night.

As the personal friend and admirer of Hoover sat at breakfast this morning, she listed the following reasons why thinking women of the United States believe in the republican candidate: "First, Hoover is an idealist, and whether or not they admit it, most of them admire and respect him for that; second, he has spent his entire life in promoting activities which naturally appeal to women, such as stabilizing home life, aiding in child welfare work and raising the plane of human life in general; third, his plan for relief work in the agricultural industry, saving of waste in industry; his constructive program for dealing with various problems as set down in his acceptance speech."

"We are on the crest of a wave of prosperity and security and it is important that those who want the United States to continue along that way should vote intelligently." When asked by a Med Tribune reporter what she says to a group of women when urging them to take an interest in governmental matters, Mrs. Burdette's eyes flashed as she replied, "If a woman simply sits at home and accepts anything that comes along instead of participating in civic life, she is merely an absorber and not a contributor in any sense."

Two years ago Mrs. Burdette was sent by the United States government as an observer at the League of Nations conference at Geneva. Previous to that time she was officially delegated to investigate international problems at various times. Traveling from state to state Mrs. Burdette, who stated incidentally that she has been interested in club work for 56 years, has been across the continent eight times. This was the fourth visit she had made to this valley, where she has several friends, including William Budge, well-known local orchardist, who had a long visit with her at the Hotel Medford last evening.

"Since May we have motored 11,000 miles attending a convention of women representing the federated clubs of America, held in San Antonio, Texas, the republican national convention, calling on Mr. Hoover later to congratulate him at Washington, visiting Quebec, Yellowstone and scores of interesting places." Mrs. Burdette said this morning before leaving here at 8 o'clock.

"This button," said Mrs. Burdette, pointing to the button on her large blue and white checkered dress, "was given to me eight years ago at the time when I was helping in another campaign for his election."

As prominent as Medford's, especially, "This is a Great Country," noticed recently on the windshields of several cars, were the two large plates, one on the bumper of the Marmon car, and the other on the back, which was presented to them at Minneapolis in appreciation of a talk by Mrs. Burdette. Mrs. Merrifield and Mrs. Burdette have been intimate friends for many years, attending several schools together in their youth. Webster Merrifield was president of the University of North Dakota for 25 years. Mrs. John Carlin of this city and Mrs. Merrifield are old acquaintances.

LITTLE INCREASE IN CLERK'S BUDGET
