Save all the autumn leaves. Either use them for mulch or the compost heap.

Set out a few clumps of multiplier onions and chives this fall. They will be appreciated.

Set a few clumps of parsley in the cold frame and you can pick parsley all winter.

Don't leave any cabbage stalks or old heads in the garden. Clean them off.

Bone meal is the best fertilizer to use with bulbs. Dig it into the soil under the bulbs and rake into the surface of the beds.

### Fall Planting for Lilies

White madonna lilies, the old fashioned white lily of gardens, a favorite for generations, with a background of the stately blue spikes of delphiniums or the pink of climbing roses, furnish one of the finest garden pictures in June.

Many gardeners have poor success with this old-fashioned bulb that, if it likes its situation, will settle down and multiply and give scores of stalks of its fragrant white blooms each year.

Prepare the beds for the planting of bulbs for spring-flowering. See that the beds are well-drained. Enrich the soil with well-rotted cow manure, and work the soil until the manure is well incorporated.

2 cups sifted flour, 2 level teaspoons baking powder, 2 tablespoons shortening, 3/4 cup milk, 1/2 level teaspoon salt.

Lemon Ice Box Cake  
1 small square cake, 1/2 cup butter, 1 cup powdered sugar, 4 tablespoons milk, 1 cup sugar, 1 tablespoon cornstarch, 3 eggs separated, 3 tablespoons lemon juice, 1/2 cup milk, 1/2 cup cream, 1/2 cup powdered sugar.

### Household Hints

#### To Pair Stockings

When the stockings have white heels or tops, mark with indelible ink. When they are all black, use colored threads, making a cross-stitch on one pair, two cross-stitches on another, and so forth.

#### To Save Mother's Strength

One mother I know puts casters on her baby's high chair. The baby can then be moved easily, and the mother is saved a great deal of lifting.

#### Flour To Remove Grease

When grease is spilled on the floor, cover the spot thickly with flour, preferably buckwheat, put a newspaper over it, and let stand overnight. In the morning brush up the flour and scrub the floor.

#### Ink On The Carpet

Sweet milk will remove ink from a carpet if it is applied immediately. Use a little warm water to remove the milk after the ink spot has disappeared.

#### To Make Lumpy Gravy Smooth

Beat with an egg beater until the lumps disappear.

#### Without Curtain Frame

Fold the lace curtain lengthwise, then pin it on a tightly stretched line with many clothespins. Now slip clean pole inside the folded curtain. This stretches the curtain satisfactorily, and saves considerable time which would otherwise be spent in fastening the curtain to the frame.

#### Shoes With Gummed Finish

Clean them with olive oil. If the leather has been scraped off, the places may be darkened with black ink. Shine the shoes with a woolen cloth.

#### A Convenient High Chair

If four rubber-tired door stops are screwed into the legs of an ordinary chair, it makes an ideal high chair for kitchen work, or for a small child.
