

3 PROMOTIONS ANNOUNCED IN NATIONAL GUARD

SALEM, Ore., Sept. 24.—(AP)—Three promotions in the Oregon National Guard are announced by General George A. White.

Major Ames O. Waller of Eugene is advanced to be a lieutenant-colonel with assignment as chief signal officer of the 41st division. Colonel Waller is a surgeon, but a graduate engineer as well, and has been with the Oregon National Guard since 1917, serving overseas.

Lieutenant James M. Wackrom of Portland is promoted to captain and made state finance officer to succeed J. N. Helgeson, who was recently discharged.

Lieutenant Able L. Merrill of Portland receives the assignment of aid-de-camp, which was vacated by the promotion of Wackrom.
