If it was up to me I'd be in favor of sending them to his sister's. Her own children are raised. She had four, too." The voice, which came through a pair of barely moving lips, stopped suddenly, and the expressionless eyes turned rather amused in the direction of the listening children.

"Here are just the same as these—one boy and three girls." The suggestion that it would be hard to part with the children brought only a faint response from the mother. She admitted that it was rather a strain waiting for the hearing, and that it would be a relief to have it over.
