Weather for Week. SAN FRANCISCO, Sept. 29.—(AP)—The weather outlook for the week beginning September 29, was announced here today by the U. S. weather bureau as follows:

Far western states: The outlook is for fair weather in southern California and southern Nevada and unsettled elsewhere during the fore part of the week.
