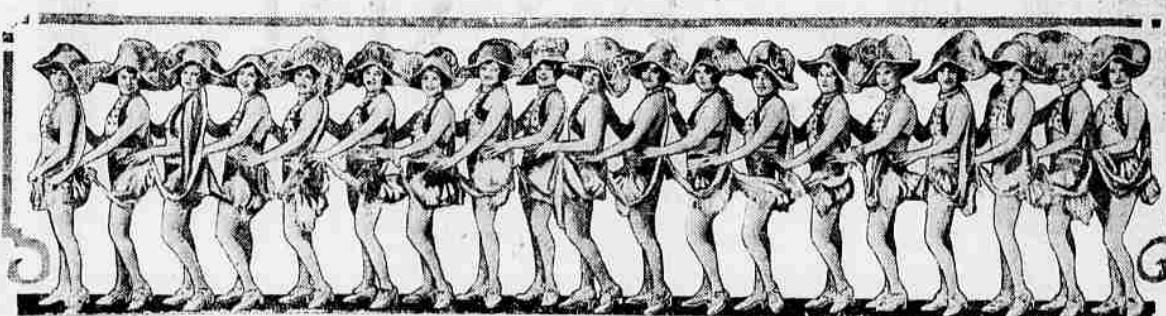


Charlie Murray, Loretta Young and Larry Kent
