SEE NEW SYSTEM BUSINESS LIGHTS IF PLEA PASSES

The petition of Sixth street property owners to form a lighting district for a modern system of street lighting on that thoroughfare between Riverside and Oakdale avenues, which was presented to the city council at its meeting last night, if it is favorably accepted, as it likely will, will possibly be the forerunner to a new modern lighting system throughout the business district, as it is generally thought that the merchants of Main street, Central avenue and other main streets will eventually form like districts.

What is puzzling the city officials at present is to see a financially clear way to shoulder a new lighting system for the other districts that may be formed in the business section. If a precedent is set by granting the Sixth street petition...

The petition, which was presented by Earl F. Felt, suggests that the system for Sixth street be as follows: Six large single lights to each block, mounted on metal posts, and lighted similar to the post in front of the California Oregon Power company building.

Mr. Felt made it plain to the city officials that the district was only seeking for a modern lighting system and was not attempting to dictate what kind of one should be adopted, and would be satisfied with any standard modern system that might be thought best to be installed.

CANNERY PRICES STILL UNDECIDED FOR PEACH CROP

The question as to what price California peach growers are to receive from the canners for the 1928 crop remained undecided today after Governor Young's mediation committee had attempted after making a final attempt to bring about an agreement.

Growers and canners therefore stand apart, but the committee has not yet announced that it had ended its work without effecting an agreement.

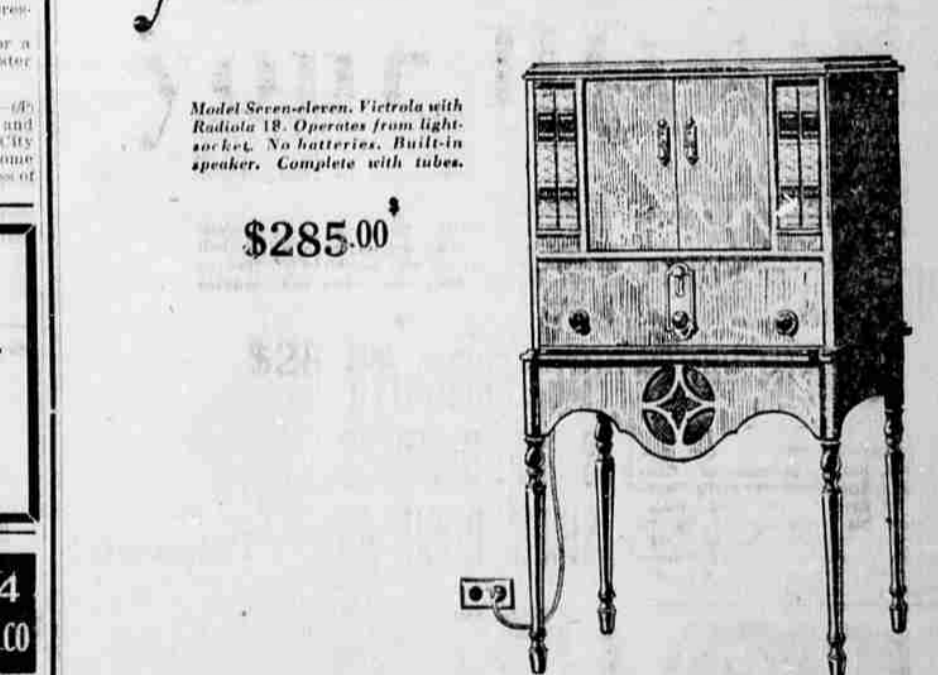
