

PRODUCE ACTIVE PORTLAND TODAY: PRICES HOLDING

Portland, Ore., Oct. 3.—Low wholesale fruit and produce markets were somewhat more active today and trading was fairly brisk in the early hours. Prices were generally easy, but a modifier than at the opening Monday.

Tomatoes were in abundant supply and of average good quality, going to the trade at 40¢ per peck. Onions continued to move in considerable quantity with Lisbon yellow Danvers fetching the best prices, from \$3.00 to \$3.25 for 1 1/2 No. 1 grade stuff.

Supplies of peaches consisted mostly of Salways, Snake river district orange cling and a few Elbertas. Salways brought \$1.00, oranges, 75¢ to \$1.00 and Elbertas 50¢ to 55¢ per box. Pears were in abundance and sold all the way from \$1.00 to \$2.75 per box, depending on variety, grade and condition.

Apples were in large supply, but the market was dull with only a normal trade. Jonathans were the most popular, going to the trade at \$1.35 to \$1.75 per box, depending on grade, pack, etc.

Country dressed meats continued to bring weak prices today, veal being difficult to move at 21¢ to 22¢, while pork sold mostly at 17 1/2¢, although an occasional choice light hog brought 14¢.

Lamb alone were firm, top grade animals bringing 22¢ to 23¢. Beef was in large supply and drab.

Poultry prices were also easy. Heavy hens were quoted at 25¢, medium hens at 18¢, and lights at 16¢, while fryers went at 25¢ and 30¢ according to weight. Demand for young was limited and commission men were also bringing raisers from shipping as yet.

Although there was some demand for young turkeys, the market was overlanded and the price was weak at 25¢ to 30¢. Poultry ducks moved fairly well at 20¢ to 22¢.

Butter and egg prices showed no changes late yesterday and the market was firm.

Wall Street Report

New York, Oct. 3.—The stock market broke sharply today on selling inspired by the unexpectedly large increase in stock exchange member loans, and then made irregular recovery as the closing hour neared.

Trading continued to be of an extremely nervous character because of the spotlight that has been thrown upon the credit situation and securities speculation in the past few days.

Concurrent strength of 100 numbers, which advanced 3 points to a new high at 35 1/2, and Mack Trucks, which moved up 2 3/4, revived merger rumors but these continued to lack official confirmation.

Borden's announced the purchase of the Thompson's Malted Milk company of Wisconsin. Several other food and chemical mergers were reported to be in the making.

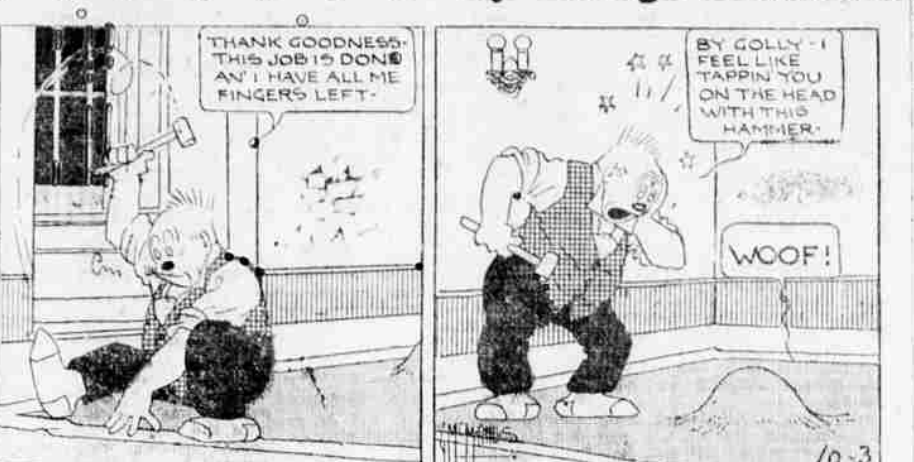

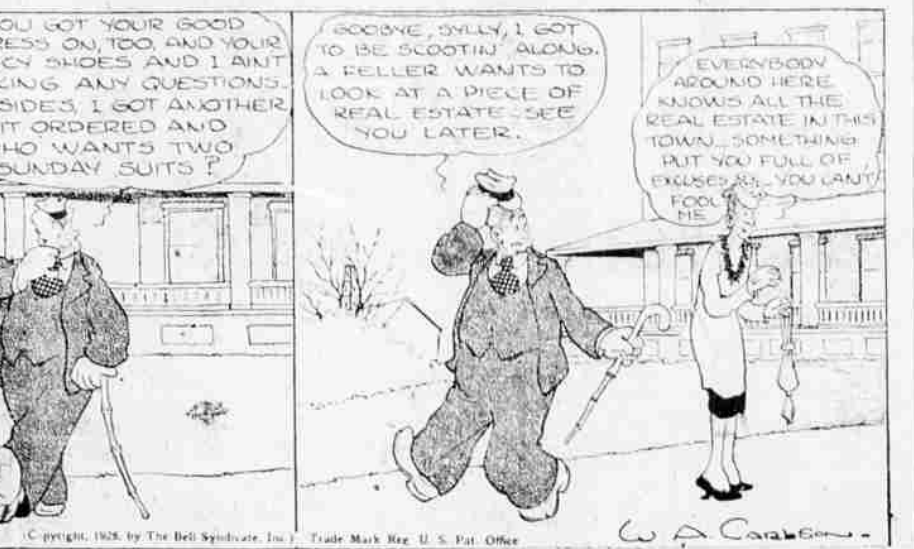
