CAPTORS RELEASE KIDNAPED BANKER; ESCAPE WITH LOOT

SHAWNEE, Okla., Oct. 4.—(AP)—Alvin H. Barker, leader of the Canadian Valley bank at Asher, Okla., who was kidnaped by three men who robbed the bank office of \$33,000 yesterday, was released by the robbers late last night near Konawa, Okla.

Barker, who telephoned officers here, said he was blindfolded in the car and could give only a sketchy description of the robbers. He said he had not been harmed, but that the men had been solicitous as to his comfort during the long ride.

Konawa is about 50 miles north-east from Asher.

TREASURY BERTH SATISFIES MELLON; NO PLANS TO QUIT

WASHINGTON, Oct. 4.—Andrew W. Mellon is well satisfied with his present work and has given no thought to changing, he said today in discussing reports that he had been selected to retain his post as secretary of the treasury in case Herbert Hoover is elected president. The secretary added that if Mr. Hoover had determined he should again head the financial department of the government he knew nothing of it.

"At my age I might as well work here as anywhere else," he said. "I have made no plans about re-igning."

Windsor Cove Bank.
SALEM, Ore., Oct. 4.—(AP)—A \$100,000 dividend, amounting to \$55,187.75 was paid yesterday in the liquidation of the Cove State bank by A. A. Schramm, state superintendent of banks. The bank was closed December 2, 1926. The bank's liabilities totaled \$32,299.44 and claims totaled \$32,667.18.

CAROL'S BROTHER REPORTED. ELOPED WITH ARISTOCRAT

BUDAPEST, Oct. 4.—(AP)—The newspaper Post Naplo said today that Prince Nicholas of Rumania had eloped with a Rumanian girl of aristocratic lineage and was living in the Paris villa of his brother, Carol, the former crown prince of Rumania. No confirmation of the report was obtainable from other sources.

The paper said the censor at Bucharest did not permit the matter to be discussed publicly, while the Rumanian court maintained that Prince Nicholas was on a holiday in Europe.

Prince Nicholas is 25 years old and visited the United States in 1926 with his mother, Queen Marie, and Princess Ileana. He is a member of the regency which rules for the six-year-old King Michael, who is his nephew and Carol's son.

Screen Life in Hollywood

HOLLYWOOD, Cal.—It seems the King of Hollywood is planning to abdicate. His reign of more than 14 years has been long enough, he feels, and he would like to spend his old age far from the pomp and pageantry of the picture palaces. So as soon as he has disposed of his southern California properties, he will retire and live somewhere beyond shouting distance of the studios.

Not that the cares of state have been a burden. His royal routine has always been either interesting or amusing, and, over a period of years, it has been rather gratifyingly profitable.

War-Made Monarch.
When first he came to Hollywood the king was known as R. C. Pennell, an Englishman who had traveled in many countries and served in several armies. Then someone started the world war, and someone else noticed that Pennell looked exactly like the new photos of King George of England. Naturally, he began to receive offers from producers who wanted him to play the king in films being on the war. And after a while casting directors began to refer to him as King George and to hire him under that name instead of his own.

A Propaganda Potentate.
The film king's appearances were not confined to ordinary motion pictures in those days. In many propaganda reels and plethorahs he "doubled" for the British king, lending muscle on American soldiers and performing other acts of royal courtesy for the good of the cause.

Since then Pennell has filled not only the film throne of King George of England, but on occasion that of the late Czar Nicholas of Russia. A slight alteration in the beard, a touch of make-up, and he does as well in the Russian role as in the other. He also has played kings of imaginary countries, and other parts not connected with thrones. In D. W. Griffith's current production, for instance, he is a diplomat.

FEAR AGGRAVATION ALBANIAN TROUBLE FOR BORDER DEATH

BELGRADE, Jugoslavia, Oct. 4.—(AP)—It was feared today that the killing of eight Jugoslav soldiers by Albanian troops would aggravate the already strained relations between Jugoslavia and the newly established kingdom of Zogu I.

Albanian troops were understood to have pursued a countryman accused of murder across the border into Jugoslav territory after the Jugoslav frontier guards had ordered them not to cross the frontier. The Jugoslavs tried to disarm the Albanians. The pursuing forces then turned their attention from the lone fugitive to the Jugoslav forces, killing eight and wounding several.

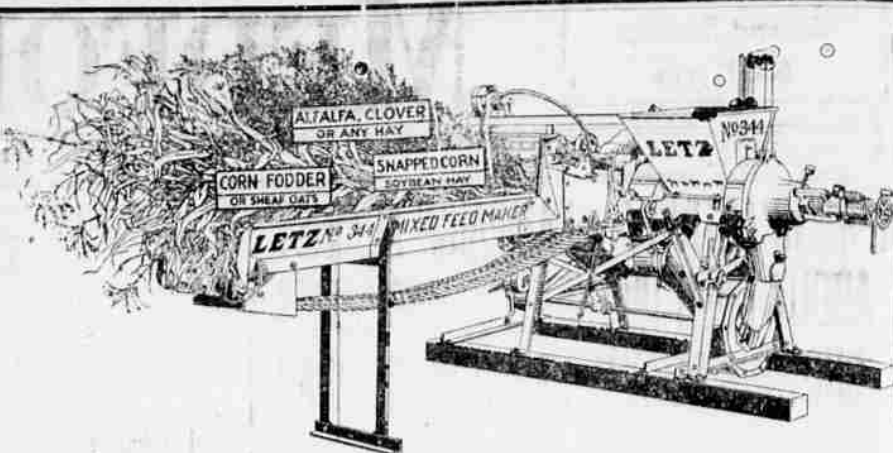
