

WALNUT GRAFTING RETURNS PROFITS IN EDEN PRECINCT

EDEN PRECINCT, Oct. 4.—I have been making a little investigation into the possibilities of those persons who have the black walnut trees planted on their places, turning these shade trees into a very profitable asset as well as a source of comfort and beauty. Many have had them grafted in the past four years and are getting some fine nuts this fall. The black walnut is of heavier stock than the French variety. The growth is much faster when grafted on the black. And this brings the trees into bearing from two to four years earlier. Not only this but many have large trees of the black which can be grafted and the cost would not be much greater than the first cost of an English orchard.
