

VIOLENCE ACTS MAY BE SOLVED BY CONFESSION

KENOSHA, Wis., Oct. 5.—(AP)—A confession that police believe clears up a homicide and other acts of violence in connection with the labor dispute here was obtained today, they announced, from Lawrence Schilling, 29, a former employee of the Allen-A company where a strike has been in progress for some months. Schilling implicated two other men in his confession and they have been placed under arrest. They are Carl Hachbach, 26, and John Burke, 29, also former employees. A man whom he named as "Louis Williams" and who, was pointed out to him as the man who was to bomb the home of an Allen-A worker in Winthrop Harbor, Ill., according to his confession, is being sought. Schilling in his confession, according to police, said that when he drove up to the headquarters one day Williams, who had a package under his arm, was pointed out to him, as the man who was to bomb the Winthrop Harbor home.
