from Europe on the Berengaria NEW YORK, Oct. 5.—(AP)—William Randolph Hearst, returning today, said he was "inclined to

favor Herbert Hoover for president simply on the basis of the continuation of the administrative system which seems to have been very successful and of benefit to the country." "I am really not opposed to Governor Smith," the publisher asserted, "but I am inclined to favor the present administrative system." He reiterated statements on the political situation made while he was abroad and said his chain of newspapers would not "go deeply into politics at all, but print the news as impartially as we can."
