

WILLIAM M' HARDY GOES ON TRIAL FEDERAL COURT

Closing arguments were made this afternoon, in the trial of William M'Hardy, pioneer resident of Klamath county, charged with the sale and possession of intoxicating liquor. M'Hardy is alleged to have dispensed wine tonics bottled under a government permit, for a beverage, when it was intended to be used only for medicinal purposes. A chemist report presented by the government showed the tonic to contain 12 per cent alcohol, which corroborated the label of the bottle.

The government charged that two Indians purchased a bottle of the tonic. Special agents testified the Indians drank the contents, "and became drunk in fifteen minutes, which Defense Counsel Fletcher, in his arguments to the jury held was "iron fact."

Attorney George M. Roberts closed for the defense, and declared "this is the most peculiar, ridiculous, insane, and absurd prosecution I have ever heard of." District Attorney George Neuner made the closing argument for the government, which was opened by Assistant District Attorney Francis Marsh. Sentence will be passed on next Tuesday by Federal Judge Bean upon Cal Callender and Gus Hirschberger of Clifton, and Jack Martin of Port Klamath, found guilty yesterday of prohibition law violations by duration. The trials of Mike Murphy of Clifton, and Ben Mitchell, an Indian, and reputed authorities say, of being one of the largest liquor dealers in Klamath county, will be heard next week.

PRINCE NICOLAS EN ROUTE HOME; ROMANCE DENIED

PARIS, Oct. 5.—(AP)—Although it was denied at the Rumanian legation that he had been summoned home because of a love affair, Prince Nicolas of Rumania was on his way to Bucharest today, accompanied by a Rumanian diplomat. His visit to Paris with a companion started rumors that he intended to follow the course of his brother, former Crown Prince Carol, even if it cost him his title.

The legation insisted that the adventure involved no such scandal as was likely to bring upon Nicolas the fate of Carol, whose affairs of the heart caused his banishment from Rumania and the loss of his right to the throne. The published report that Nicolas had eloped with an aristocratic Rumanian was energetically described by the legation as false, although it was not denied that Nicolas had been in Paris with a woman.

The prince sought privacy with a vengeance as he boarded the Orient express. He slipped into the train from the station-master's private office and gave photographers the slip.

So determined upon privacy was Nicolas that he even failed to call to his elder brother, Carol, who as Mr. Carol Caraiman was stopping at one of the palatial hotels on the Champs Elysees within a stone's throw of that occupied by Nicolas during his brief visit.

Carol, however, had heard of the presence of Nicolas in Paris and joined his brother late yesterday afternoon and gave him some sound advice about returning to Rumania. He even accompanied Nicolas to the railway station and saw him safely aboard the train.
