

TRADING VOLUME IS FAIRLY GOOD PORTLAND TODAY

Portland, Ore., Oct. 8.—(AP) Trading was in fairly good volume on local wholesale produce markets this morning with prices showing little change from Saturday.

Offerings of produce were small, Saturday from The Dalles at 3 1/2 and Orange County from the Snake River district at 75.4-9.96 comprising the bulk of supply. A few offerings out of cold storage were also to be had but demand was slow at 15.5-50c per box. Peas were in large supply and sold at a wide range of price, all the way from \$1.00 to \$2.75 per box depending on variety and grade. Apples were likewise plentiful supply all about steady.

Cranberries were in large supply and a little cheaper at \$5.00-5.75 per 1-2 barrel box. Offerings included Cape Cod, Burgen, and McFarlin varieties. Grapes were a bit firmer today, much of the overcrop of the last two weeks having been disposed of.

Tomatoes were in heavy supply on the vegetable market and movement was sluggish although prices were as low as \$5.50-50c per box for first class stuff.

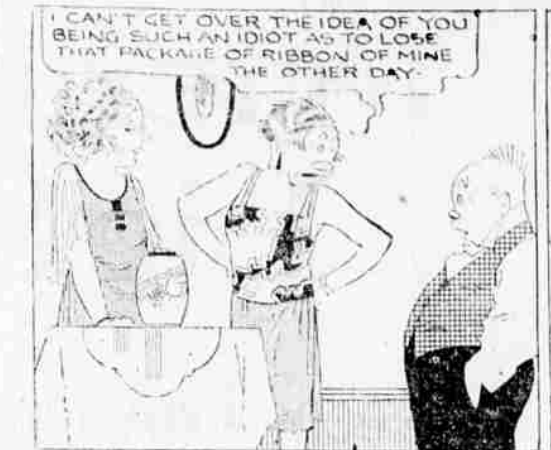
Local dry packed lettuce supplies most of the demand in that division today, prices ranging from \$1.25 to \$1.50 per crate.

Feeling in the butter and egg markets was bullish, with offerings of fresh eggs light and inquiry active. Shippers were taking everything obtainable at Saturday's quotations, in some cases peering a shade more for carefully selected white extras.

Porkers were weak on the country dressed meat markets but not notably lower, sales being too few to really establish prices in the early hour. Carry over of veal and hogs was heavy while lambs were in small supply and good demand.
