

### MINISTRY ORDERS HEARST REPORTER TO LEAVE FRANCE

PARIS, France, Oct. 9.—(AP)—Harold Horan, correspondent of the New York American, has been requested to leave France before Thursday because of his connection with the publication through the Hearst news service of a memorandum covering the Anglo-French naval pact. The press bureau of the ministry of foreign affairs notified Horan that France considered him an "undesirable foreigner" and warned him that he might be the object of a decree of expulsion.

The continental edition of the London Daily Mail today printed a statement furnished by the Paris bureau of the International News Service saying that Horan had finally consented to accept a decree of expulsion and thus undertook to leave French soil. He was offered the choice of doing this or going to Santez prison, where he would be detained at the disposal of an examining magistrate. The statement concluded by saying "the French foreign office declines to take any action in the matter."

### MEXICO SHAKEN BY EARTHQUAKE OVER WIDE AREA

MEXICO CITY, Oct. 9.—(AP)—Five persons were injured and damage was done over a wide area by an earthquake which rocked Mexico City and nine states of Mexico last night, reports to police and newspaper dispatches stated today.

One family in the suburb of Tacuba was buried by the collapse of a wall which crushed the humble wooden shack in which they lived, injuring one child seriously and four other persons. Several buildings in various parts of Mexico City were damaged.

Dispatches from Oaxaca said that the earthquake was violent there and that a large part of the southern section of the city was in ruins with other sections badly damaged. The inhabitants everywhere fled in panic.

The Pacific port of Acapulco in the state of Guerrero was violently shaken and several buildings were damaged.

The town of Chalco in the state of Mexico was also greatly damaged, the walls of the city hall and other buildings collapsing.

Prisoners in the town jail mutilated during the earthquake and attempted to break open the doors of the cells and escape. Guards finally restored order.

### PILGRIMS VISIT HOOVER'S FARM; HOLD MEETINGS

SAN FRANCISCO, Oct. 9.—(AP)—The Republican state committee announced yesterday that the farm owned by Herbert Hoover, Republican presidential nominee, near Wasco, Cal., has become a mecca for political pilgrims as a result of which "its model character was made known."

The statement said that publicity resulting from criticisms by political enemies of methods of operation on the Hoover farm had caused the pilgrimages and that many political meetings had been held on it since.

The Hoover farm contains 1300 acres, most of it under cultivation. It produces cotton, alfalfa, fruit, and has on it large herds of livestock.

The Republican statement said critics had pictured Mr. Hoover as an employer of alien labor and a hard task master and that the management of his farm was such that he could not qualify as a solver of farm problems.

A public investigator, the statement said, showed the charges to be wholly without foundation.

### BITS OF BODIES BEING RECOVERED IN PRISON RUINS

JUNCTION CITY, Ohio, Oct. 9.—(AP)—With a total of 26 prisoners missing, all of them believed dead, and 27 injured, work of recovering charred bits of bodies from the smoking ruins of the dormitory of the Ohio penitentiary brick plant continued.

Identification of the mutilated remains was practically impossible, so completely had the flames done their work yesterday. Officials in charge, however, believed they had identified three as those of John Duncan, Toledo negro; Moses Broncho, Franklin county negro, and Ray Cooper of Fairfield county.

### NEW YORK WIDOW IN DEATH FALL

NEW YORK, Oct. 9.—(AP)—Mrs. Arthur E. Stillwell, widow of the railroad builder who died two weeks ago, jumped or fell to her death today from her apartment on the twelfth floor of a West End avenue building. Her body landed on the roof of an adjoining structure.

Mrs. E. W. Robb, Mrs. Stillwell's sister-in-law, and Mr. Robb were in the apartment at the time. Mrs. Stillwell, according to the police, left a letter addressed to Mrs. Robb. Its contents were not made public.

Mrs. Stillwell's husband, who died September 2, was a railroad builder and a former president of the Kansas City, Pittsburg & Gulf railroad and other lines. Mrs. Stillwell was about 68 years old.

### JAPANESE SHIPS HIT BY TYPHOON

TOKYO, Japan, Oct. 9.—(AP)—Three Japanese freighters—the Oyama Maru, the Fukel Maru and the Hukuyama Maru—were reported today to be in distress off the east coast of Japan after a typhoon which swept the region last night.

The Fukel Maru reported that two seamen had been washed overboard and perished. The Hukuyama Maru was en route to Japan from Grays Harbor, Wash. Warcraft was ordered from Yokosuka naval station to assist the vessels.

Many fishing craft were missing.

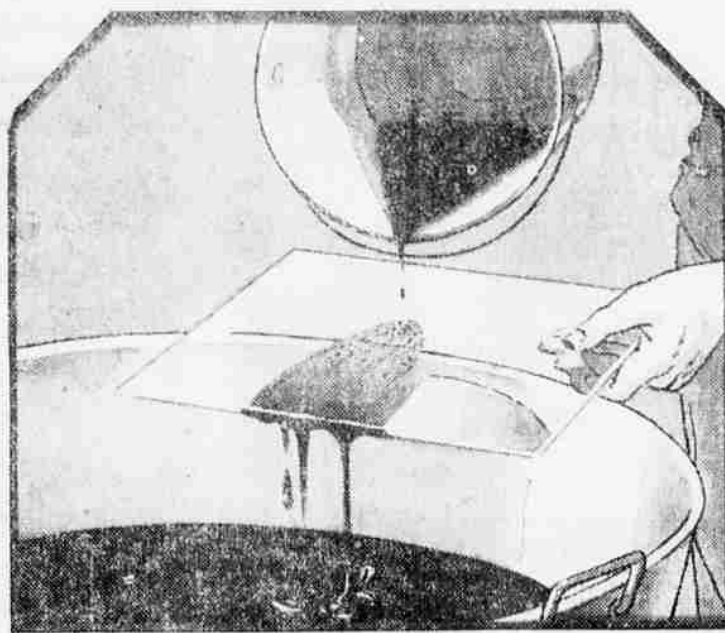

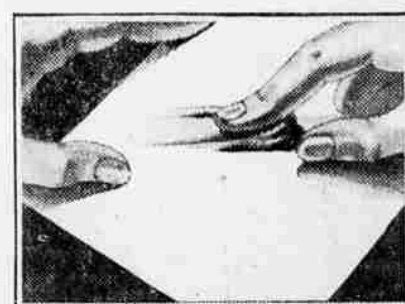
