

EXPERT 'LIDDER' AT BLUE GOOSE RECORD BREAKER

Tom Moore, professional "litter" now employed at the Blue Goose packing plant, drives more nails during one single day than any other man in Medford. In fact, it is believed that he holds the record among all the "lidders" in existence.

A story in the Morning Oregonian for October 19 from Hood River, Ore., stated that Robert Neal holds the record for speed when it comes to putting tops on packed fruit. He was reported to have put out 209 boxes in 10 hours at 50 cents per 100.

Mr. Moore, who, by the way, is not a relative of the actor by that name, read the story and rejoiced. His biggest day, officially chalked up in the company's books was during the height of the pear season when he drove a total of 31,264 nails in 268 boxes.

For 12 years Mr. Moore, who makes his headquarters in California, has lidded fruit and each year his speed increases, he said today. This is the third year he has worked in local plants.

The average man employed to lid boxes nails up from 700 to 800 per day, E. S. Coe, manager of the Blue Goose, said in comparing his man with others not so fast.

ACID SPRAY HITS PACKING FOREMAN INJURING EYES

A. C. Arthur, foreman at the Blue Goose packing plant, was painfully injured early Thursday morning when a two-inch pipe conveying hydro chloride acid to the washing machine broke as he was examining a small leak. A spray of the acid hit Mr. Arthur in both eyes blinding him for some time.

Operations at the plant were suspended for several hours and Dr. A. E. Dodson was called to administer first aid, after which Mr. Arthur was taken to his home at the Holladay hotel where he was kept in a darkened room all day.

According to the doctor in attendance there will probably be no permanent injury to the foreman's eyesight but he will be compelled to remain in his room for three or four days. No one was near him at the time of the accident.

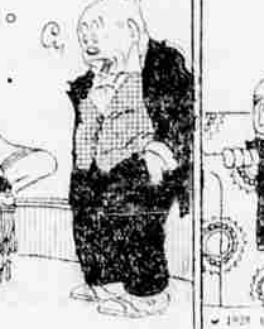

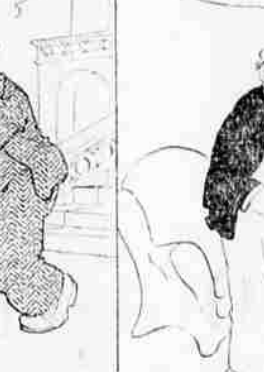

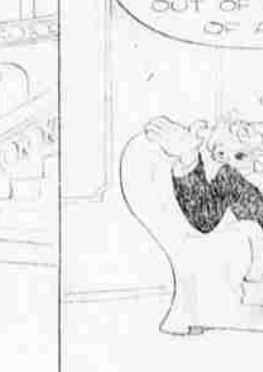
