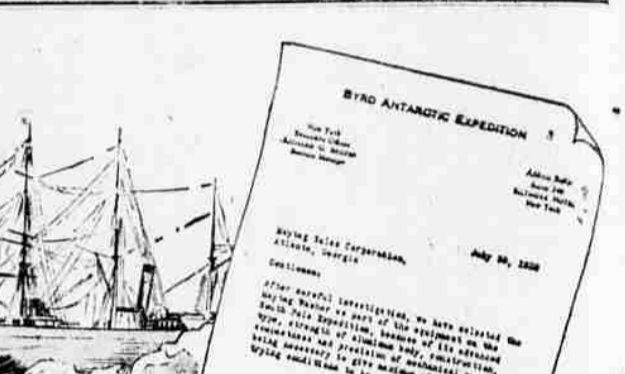

Dirigible Stamps Find Big Demand by Philatelists

NEW YORK, Oct. 18.—(AP)—Cancelled stamps on envelopes and postcards brought to this country by the Graf Zeppelin are causing keen competition among stamp collectors and dealers, with 33 being reported quoted for the four-mark stamps on envelopes and 52 for the two-mark stamps on postcards.

Postoffice officials said the Zeppelin's mail consisted of 15 sacks containing 28,124 letters and 27,599 postcards. They said arrangements probably would be made for the dirigible to carry mail on her return trip.
