STOCK SALESMEN USE TELEGRAPH

SALEM, Ore., Oct. 19.—(AP)—What is known as the "telegram method" is being used by unscrupulous salesmen to sell worthless stock in Oregon. State Corporation Commissioner Mark D. McCallister said today. The salesman, who is unqualified to sell stock in Oregon, makes his sale to the purchaser, then the buyer signs a telegram, personally sending his order to the company.

"Many persons could be saved their money and greater compensation would be given the state in its effort to suppress the sale of worthless securities," McCallister said. "If people would investigate before buying rather than wait to report the matter after they make the purchase and find they have been deceived, and the salesman has departed beyond the pale of jurisdiction."
