SMITH AGREES WITH HOOVER

G OVERNOR SMITH has placed himself on record, with Mr. Hoover, as opposed to invoking the national origins clause of the Immigration Act of 1924.

The national origins clause, scheduled now to take effect on July 1, 1929, would limit quota immigration to 150,000 annually, and would base the distributions of quotas among foreign nations on the population of the United States in 1920, instead of the 1890 census, as is now the case.

In his speech of acceptance at Albany Governor Smith announced that he was "opposed to the principle of restriction based upon the figures of immigrant population contained in a census thirty-eight years old."

In St. Paul, after more than a month in which to heed the advice of his friends, notably that of Mr. Walter Lippmann of the New York World, the governor discovered that the Republican candidate "said that the national origins law was not workable. I agree with him."

With this pronouncement, the immigration question is removed as an issue from the current campaign. Both candidates favor modification of the law of 1924 so as to prevent the separation of families.

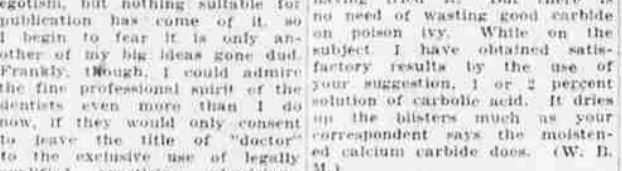
